Introduction

The 2012-2013 Data Book provides, in a single document, a profile of the Leon County School District in a series of school and student indicators of performance.

It includes information most commonly asked for by school personnel, district staff, Board members, parents, and the community-at-large. The profile provides a common database for review and discussion.

The document also allows for a search of patterns identifying strengths and weaknesses in the overall instructional program of the district. It is intended to assist school and district level managers to assess school programs and to plan effectively for future school improvement activities. It is hoped that the document serves as a sourcebook for needs assessment and school improvement planning for the up-coming school year.

The Data Book is organized according to the six Priorities of Florida's K-20 Education, Leon County School District 2004-2009 Strategic Plan Goals, and the 2012 -2013 Leon County Schools Priorities. It presents multi-year statistics of the district schools such as information on schools and student characteristics, educational programs and services, the learning environment, student test results, and other outcomes of schooling. The data presented in the Data Book is compiled from the Florida School Indicators Report (FSIR), the Florida Department of Education (DOE) Surveys 2, 5, 9 and other data reports. A glossary of terms used in the document is also included.

INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE (IB) PROGRAMME

The International Baccalaureate Programme is a magnet offering opened in 1994, which draws academically motivated students from the entire Leon County school system. The students in IB represent multiple ethnic, economic, and racial backgrounds. Rickard's 240 IB students make up 18.8% of the total population of the school.

The curriculum for grades 9 and 10 consist of a pre-IB foundational structure designed to provide the student with sufficient academic, analytic, theoretical, and practical skill to perform at an international level. The 11th and 12th grade curriculum consists of comprehensive and rigorous formal curriculum sanctioned by the IB Curriculum and Assessment Centre in Cardiff, Wales. Each course of study concludes with an internationally standardized examination. The general objectives of the IB are to provide students with a balanced education, to facilitate geographic and cultural mobility, and to promote international understanding through a shared academic experience.

In order to receive the International Baccalaureate Diploma, students must complete the curriculum as prescribed by the International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO). Course work for the junior and senior years requires instruction in English (Language A), a secondary language (Language B), experimental science, social studies, mathematics, and a sixth subject. The sixth subject offerings at Rickards include an IB Music, IB Visual Arts, an additional language or science, art, psychology, and philosophy. Students must score successfully on IB exams in all six of these subjects. A Theory of Knowledge course must be successfully completed as well. In addition, between 10th and 12th grades, students must participate in at least 150 documented hours of extracurricular creativity, action, and service as well as write and present a supervised extended essay of at least 4,000 words.

The rich diversity of our student body serves to enhance the environment in the classroom. What is not indicated is the richness of the home countries of these students who fit, somewhat, into these generalized categories. For example, in the numbers of White students listed above are students from Germany, Switzerland, Denmark, Italy, Bulgaria, France, Canada, Poland, Romania and the USA. Students who rank themselves as Black come to us from Nigeria, Belize, Zimbabwe, Jamaica, Tanzania, Cameroon, Ethiopia, Ivory Coast, and the USA. Our third largest category, Asian students, represent China, India, Viet Nam, India, Pakistan and Korea. Hispanic students span the globe similarly, representing Spain, Mexico, Peru, Puerto Rico, Phillipines, and the United States. Students who choose the "Other" category are often less specific for various reasons; some are bi-racial, or bi-ethnic, and prefer not to identify with one parent over another. In IB, we find this diversity as a source of academic and social strength.

In May 2013, the Rickards IB program graduated its fifteenth senior class. Students were tested on Higher Level (HL) and Standard Level (SL). The (HL) indicates that students have had at least 240 hours of Instruction; the (SL) indicates that they have had a minimum of 150.

Students are required to take English, a second language, and courses in history, science, and math. Students are allowed to choose an elected or sixth subject area, such as Psychology, Visual Arts, Theater or an additional science, for this sixth subject. Students earning at least 24 points out of the possible 45 receive the diploma. The counts indicate the number of students scoring in each category.



Glossary

Glossary

All Curriculum Groups

Data summarizing the results for all students tested at a school and includes standard curriculum, Exceptional Student Education (ESE) and English Language Learners (ELLs) students.

All Curriculum (Matched)

Students defined by the State as all curriculum students who received test results and were at the same school for Survey 2 (October) and Survey 3 (February). Eligible students include standard curriculum, ESE, and ELL students.

All Year Enrollment

All year enrollment covers all students who were enrolled in a school at any time during the regular 180-day school year.

Average Daily Attendance

The average daily attendance is determined by dividing the total number of days attended by the total number of days enrolled during the 180-day school year.

District-Wide Programs:

Adult and Community Education (ACE):

ACE is the primary provider of adult education classes in Leon County. The school offers the following programs and services: GED Testing; English Language Learners (ELL) classes; high school credit courses needed to meet graduation requirements for a high school diploma; GED classes to prepare students for the GED test; senior learner classes for senior adults; and classes for adults with disabilities.

Early Childhood Programs:

The early childhood programs offered through Leon County Schools serve children birth through five years of age eligible for one or more of the following:

Prekindergarten Exceptional Student Education

The prekindergarten exceptional student education program serves students ages three and four identified through screening and evaluation as exceptional student education students. Classes are located at almost every elementary school in Leon County and at the Early Childhood Professional Development Center, the Wesson Early Childhood Professional Development Center, and at Creative Preschool. Screenings and evaluations are conducted at the Early Childhood Professional Development Center on the campus of Lively Technical School.

School Readiness Prekindergarten Program

The School Readiness Program is administered by the Early Learning Coalition of the Big Bend (ELC). Leon County Schools contracts with the ELC to provide three- and four-year-old children, whose parents meet federal and state eligibility guidelines, either a full-day prekindergarten program or a three-hour prekindergarten program combined with the three-hour voluntary prekindergarten program. Eligible families are assessed monthly fees based on a sliding scale. If families become ineligible, they may choose to pay the cost of the prekindergarten program themselves. Parents must work with the ELC to determine eligibility.

Voluntary Prekindergarten Program

The voluntary prekindergarten program (VPK) is administered by the Early Learning Coalition of the Big Bend (ELC). Leon County contracts with the ELC to provide a three-hour-a-day VPK program to eligible children who are four years old by September 1 of each school year. Three-hour VPK programs are only offered at selected school sites. In addition to the three-hour VPK-only programs, selected schools also offer VPK programs combined with private pay programs, which operate for a full school day. Parents are assessed a monthly fee for the hours not covered by VPK funding.

Private Pay

Available to children from the community who pay registration and tuition fees. This program is available for families at the Early Childhood Professional Development Center, Gretchen Everhart, and Conley Elementary School. There is limited enrollment and children must meet licensing and Leon County School requirements.

Children of Teen Parents

Available to children of teen parents currently enrolled in and actively attending a Leon County school. This program is located at the Early Childhood Professional Development Center on the campus of Lively Technical Center. Programs are available through prekindergarten.

Gretchen Everhart School

Gretchen Everhart School is a special day school that serves exceptional education students in grades Pre-K through 12 whose individual educational plan supports the need for placement in the school.

Hospital/Homebound

The hospital/homebound program serves students who are out of school due to illness or surgery. Eligibility is determined through a staffing process after required information is provided by a physician. Students are provided academic support through a variety of models including but not limited to: virtual school, online education with direct teacher support, first support from certified teachers through visits to the home, hospital and by phone and computer, etc.

Juvenile Justice/Contracted Program Sites

AMI Kids (DJJ Day Treatment Program)
DISC Woodville Alternative Learning Center Residential Program (DCF Program)
Leon Juvenile Detention Center (Multicounty DJJ Detention Center)
Pace Center for Girls (*DJJ Prevention Program*)

Lively Technical Center

A career/technical school offering vocational courses of study for high school and adult students.

Pace Secondary

A special day school for exceptional education students, usually exhibiting behavioral and/or emotional handicapping conditions, whose individual educational plan supports the need for placement in the school.

Second Chance at Ghazvini Learning Center

Second Chance is a program that serves students who are unable to function successfully in a regular school setting due to possible expulsion, suspension, problems with disruptive behavior and involvement with the juvenile justice system.

School for Arts and Innovative Learning (SAIL)

SAIL is a nontraditional magnet high school that specializes in providing a small nurturing environment with a wide variety of flexible learning paths for students.

Success Academy at Ghazvini Learning Center

The Success Academy creates a unique and adaptable educational environment that will meet student needs and aspirations, allowing students to excel in the curriculum at an accelerated pace and to recover from academic deficiencies, assisting them in reaching their highest potential and achieving the goal of earning high school diplomas.

Teenage Parent Program (TAPP):

TAPP provides educational and support services to teen parents. Teen parents may remain in zoned schools or may attend the TAPP Program located at the Success Academy located on the Ghazvini Learning Center campus. Regular school programs provide access to support services in the community. The TAPP Program provides an individualized academic program along with support services and parenting programs on campus.

Dropout and Withdrawal Codes

Students in grades PK-12 who have withdrawn from school have been assigned a dropout withdrawal reason code. Dropout codes are underlined and designated by an asterisk(*). Dropout and Withdrawal codes for grades PK-12 are as follows:

Dropout Rate

The annual percentage calculated by dividing the number of students in grades 9 through 12 who are classified as dropouts, by the total number of students in grades 9 through 12 in attendance at anytime during the school year.

ECHOS

See the Florida Kindergarten Readiness Screener (FLKRS)

English Language Learners (ELLs)

Programs that provide instruction to limited English proficient students who have difficulty in listening, speaking, reading, or writing the English language.

Exceptional Student Education (ESE)

The ESE/ Florida Education Finance Program Model (ESE/FEFP) is designed to encourage schools to identify and implement instructional delivery strategies that are better for students and educationally effective. There are five cost factors for ESE programs. Three of the cost factors are included in Group 1 and are part of the ESE guarantee allocation. Cost Factors 254 and 255 are part of the Group 2 weighted cost factors. The cost factors are determined by documenting the services that a student will receive using a matrix of services. Cost factors relate to the severity of the student's need and the intensity of support required, not a category of exceptionality. Students generate funding using a single cost factor across the entire school week (with some exceptions).

Expenditures per Student

Expenditures per student vary depending on the number of students served and the kinds of programs offered. For example, a school that is an exceptional student center for the district will have a higher per student expenditure than one that does not offer exceptional student education programs.

FCAT 2.0- Reading and Mathematics

The FCAT is a criterion referenced tests. The Florida Department of Education (FDOE) is transitioning from the FCAT to the FCAT 2.0 to align with new student academic content standards. The FCAT 2.0 measures student achievement of the NGSSS (Next Generation Sunshine State Standards) in reading, and mathematics, in place of the *Sunshine State Standards*. As FCAT 2.0 assessments are phased in, they will replace existing FCAT assessments.

The FCAT 2.0 Reading tests include all multiple choice questions at grade levels 3-10. Passing score requirements for Grade 3 must achieve a Level 2 or higher in reading, or show good cause, to be eligible for promotion. Grade 10 students must have a passing score of 300 for graduation purposes.

The FCAT 2.0 Mathematics tests include multiple choice questions for grades 3-8, and gridded response items are included in grades 4-8. Students in grades 7-8 use calculators on the Mathematics test.

FCAT SSS Science

FCAT Science measures student progress on benchmarks identified in the Sunshine State Standards. The FCAT SSS Science tests include multiple choice questions for grades 5 and 8. Gridded response items are also included in the grade 8 test. In addition, students in grade 8 use calculators on the Science test. FCAT 2.0 Science assessments will be administered in 2013 in grades 5 and 8.

FCAT Writing

For this assessment, 4th, 8th, and 10th grade students are required to write independently, within a 45-minute timeframe, to a given prompt (topic).

The types of prompts used are:

Narrative (4th grade)

Writing that tells about a personal or fictional experience or tells a story based on a real or imagined event.

Expository (4th/8th grades)

Writing that gives information, explains why or how, clarifies a process or defines a concept.

Persuasive (8th/10th grades)

Writing to convince the reader that a reader should take specific action.

The Florida Education and Training Placement Information Program (FETPIP)

FETPIP is a data collection system that obtains follow-up data on former students and others. The information includes employment, continuing postsecondary education, military, public assistance participation, and incarceration data.

The Florida Kindergarten Readiness Screener (FLKRS)

FLKRS was developed using a subset of items from two published assessments; Early Childhood Observation System™ (ECHOS™) and Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills (DIBELS) to gather information about the readiness of all public school children entering kindergarten. In general, all children entering a public school kindergarten for the first time within the first 45 days must be screened using the ECHOS and the DIBELS.

ECHOS

A continuous observational assessment system for kindergarten through grade 2. It offers a rich story of how each child is progressing toward national and state standards and toward meeting grade-level expectations. ECHOS measures benchmarks in seven domains based on the guidelines and standards of National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC) and other national organizations. The seven domains are:

- Language and Literacy
- Mathematics
- Social and Personal Skills

- Science
- Social Studies
- Physical Development and Fitness
- Creative Arts

Teachers observe children naturally engaged in their classroom activities. They assess each child's skills, knowledge, and performance related to grade-level expectations, assigning one of four progress level ratings:

- Not Yet Demonstrating (NYD)
- Emerging (EMG)
- Progressing (PRG)
- Consistently Demonstrates (CDM)

Florida Assessments for Instruction in Reading (FAIR)

FAIR is the state instrument used to measure progress in reading. Schools administer FAIR or other reliable instruments three times a year to determine how students in Intensive Reading classes are progressing in their reading development.

Free or Reduced-Price Lunch

Percentage of students eligible for free or reduced-price lunch may be a reflection of the economic status of the school community and may indicate additional student educational needs.

FTE

This abbreviation refers to a full-time equivalent staff position.

Gifted

In order to qualify for instruction in a program for gifted students, one must be recommended, be evaluated through test scores, and have a need for the program.

Graduation Rates

Florida currently calculates three graduation rates: the NGA rate, which was mandated by the Florida Legislature in 2006 to meet an agreement with the National Governors Association Compact and was first implemented using the data for 2004-05 and reported in the 2005-06 NCLB SPARs; a rate for No Child Left Behind (NCLB) reporting purposes, implemented in 2001; and Florida's regular rate, which has been calculated consistently since 1998-99.

All three versions use the cohort method of tracking individual students in and out of the system from their entrance into the ninth grade through completion four years later. However, each rate defines a graduate differently. The differences between the NGA rate, the NCLB rate, and Florida's regular graduation rate are as follows:

- The NGA graduation rate counts as graduates recipients of standard and special diplomas but not GEDs.
- The NCLB graduation rate counts as graduates recipients of standard diplomas and GEDs awarded to high school students but not special diplomas and GEDs awarded to adult students.
- Florida's regular rate counts all diploma recipients as graduates. This includes standard and special diplomas and all GEDs.

Graduation Requirements

Students who expect to graduate from high school in the school year and beyond must earn passing scores on the Grade 10 FCAT Reading 2.0 and FCAT Mathematics 2.0 tests. Passing scores for the Grade 10 FCAT 2.0 are determined by the State Board of Education. The current Grade 10 passing scores are as follows:

- FCAT 2.0 Reading – 245 (Developmental Scale Score of 1926) or above
- FCAT 2.0 Mathematics – 300 (Developmental Scale Score of 1889) or above

First time ninth graders and middle school students taking Algebra I, Biology 1, and Geometry must pass the EOC to receive high school credit for the course. For first time ninth graders taking U.S. History, the results of the EOC account for 30% of their course grade.

High Academic Courses

Course enrollment is based on at least 9 weeks of enrollment for courses for grades 09 to 12 only. The course level was used from the DOE course code directory based on 2006-07 Level 3 Courses, which are defined as Honors, International Baccalaureate (IB), Advanced Placement (AP), Advanced International Certification Education (AICE), and other rigorous and advanced college-preparatory courses. Courses in prior years with the same course code but without 2006-07 Levels were recoded to 2006-07 Levels in order to find prior year classes of same type. Courses were only pulled from the normal 180-day school year. "All" enrollment is based on same criteria as a comparison number for within group.

International Baccalaureate

The International Baccalaureate (IB) program is a comprehensive and rigorous two-year curriculum, leading to examinations, for students aged between sixteen and nineteen. Based on the pattern of no single country, it is a deliberate compromise between the specialization required in some national systems and the breadth preferred in others.

The general objectives of the IB are to provide students with a balanced education; to facilitate geographic and cultural mobility; and to promote international understanding through a shared academic experience. In more than twenty-five years since its founding, the IB Diploma has become a symbol of academic integrity and intellectual promise.

The student who satisfies its demands demonstrates a strong commitment to learning, both in terms of the mastery of subject content and in the development of the skills and discipline necessary for success in a competitive world.

Learning Environment

An environment that is conducive to teaching and learning. Adequate facilities, educational materials, equipment, teachers, and staff are provided to all students and the school climate reflects the traditions, cultures, and behaviors of all stakeholders. Stakeholders are involved and exhibit high expectations for achievement and behavior. In Leon County, the Climate Survey was developed to assess the learning environment.

Mean

A type of average score calculated by adding all the scores and dividing by the number of scores. Not all types of scores are suitable for averaging (i.e., percentiles).

Median

The middle score in a set of scores that have been arranged from lowest to highest (ranked); the score that divides the group or ranked scores into two equal parts. Half of the scores are below the median and half above it.

National Percentile

A percentile that uses a national sample of students as the comparison group. For example, if a second grade student scores a national percentile ranking of 74 in mathematics, he/she scored higher than 74% of the students in the national sample of second graders in mathematics.

Norm Referenced Test

A type of test that compares a student's score to the performance of a standardized group.

October Membership

The number of students enrolled in the school during a designated week in October, same as Survey 2 membership.

Parental Involvement

Communities, school boards, and schools provide opportunities for involving parents and guardians as active partners in achieving school improvement and education accountability.

Percentile

A score that indicates the percent of students scoring the same or lower than a particular student's score. Percentile is not the same as the percentage of questions answered correctly.

Personnel

Professional and Non-professional Staff

Administrative Staff – The administrative staff is composed of all personnel responsible for the planning, administration and supervision of the total instructional program and for all supporting services such as maintenance, transportation, school food service, personnel, purchasing, federal programs, payrolls and all other responsibilities as directed by the superintendent. The administrative staff specifically includes program specialists, principals, and professional administrative assistants.

Instructional Staff – The instructional staff is composed of those school-based personnel, other than principals, who are assigned direct responsibility for the supervision, instruction and evaluation of students and specifically includes teachers, librarians, counselors, psychologists, resource teachers and non-certified specialists

Support Staff – Includes all clerical, maintenance, custodial, transportation, school food service, teacher aides and all other nonprofessional employees not required to hold a teaching certificate for the position held.

Postsecondary Education Readiness Test (PERT)

The Postsecondary Education Readiness Test (PERT) is Florida's customized common placement test. The purpose of the PERT is accurate course placement based on the student's skills and abilities. The PERT is aligned with the Postsecondary Readiness Competencies identified by Florida faculty as necessary for success in entry-level college credit coursework. The PERT assessment system includes Placement and Diagnostic tests in mathematics, reading and writing.

Quartile

The set of scores resulting from the division of a score scale into four parts. For example, for a score scale ranging from 1 to 99, quartiles would contain scores from 1 to 25, 26 to 50, 51 to 75, and 76 to 99, respectively.

Racial/Ethnic Groups

Designations used are: Black Non-Hispanic, White Non-Hispanic, Hispanic, Asian/Pacific Islander, Multiracial, and American Indian/Alaskan Native.

Black: not of Hispanic origin, all persons having origin in any of the black racial groups of Africa.

Hispanic: all persons of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central, or South American, or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.

Asian or Pacific Islander: all persons having origins in any of the original people of the Far East, Southeast Asia, the Indian Subcontinent, or the Pacific Islands.

American Indian or Alaska Native: all persons having origins in any of the original people of North America, and who maintain cultural identification through tribal affiliation or community recognition.

White: not of Hispanic origin, all persons having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, North Africa, or the Middle East.

Multiracial: a person having parents of different racial/ethnic categories.

School Improvement Plan

An annual comprehensive school-level plan of action based upon an assessment against the goals, standards, and outcomes. The improvement plan should include at least the following elements:

- Goals
- Needs Assessment
- Indicators of Student Progress
- Instructional research-based programs and strategies for improvement
- Evaluation Procedures

School Accountability Reports

Annual reports of the results of the statewide assessment program which act as a report card, grading the performance of each district and school from A to F, using data from the FCAT Reading, Math, Science, and Writing. In 2009-2010, additional components were added for high schools.

School Performance Levels

School Performance Levels (A, B, C, D, and F) are designed by the state to identify high and low performing schools and summarize information about school achievement. These Levels are based on certain "school indicators" defined by the state.

Score Distributions

The number and/or percent of scores falling within a particular range of scores.

Stability Rate

The percentages of students in the October membership count who are still present in the second semester (February count). District and state-level data are calculated by school type.

Standard Curriculum (Matched)

Students defined by the State as standard curriculum students who received test results and were at the same school for Survey 2 and Survey 3. Eligible students also include speech impaired, gifted, hospital/homebound and LEP with more than two years in ESOL.

Standard Curriculum (Unmatched)

All standard curriculum students who received test results regardless of when they entered the school.

Survey 2 (Enrollment)

A designated week in October where the state collects student data for funding purposes. See also October membership.

Survey 3 (Enrollment)

A designated week in February where the states collect student data for funding purposes.

Survey 5 (End-of-the-year)

Occurs in August each year and covers the first day of school to the day before the beginning of the first day of school the following year.

Survey 9

Occurs in December each year and is an ESE only data collection activity.

Program Background

The Leon County School Choice Program was adopted in 1999 and in the spring of 2000, efforts began to implement the program for students entering the 2000-01 school year. This program is now in its thirteenth year (2013-14) of success. The primary focus is to provide options for students to attend a school that best meets their specific needs and maximizes their opportunity to learn. The program also provides choice options to families with documented medical and economic hardships. Magnets can be effective for revitalizing schools, for furthering desegregation and the racial and socioeconomic balancing of schools, and to better utilize school capacities.

A magnet program is a course of instruction with a specific curricular theme or instructional approach. These programs are usually located within a school that continues to offer a general program of studies for its students. A magnet school is one in which the entire student body participates in the special curricular theme(s) or instructional strategies. Students must meet criteria specified in the approved magnet plan to be selected to a magnet program or school. Magnets intend to attract students of all races and backgrounds from a broad geographic area regardless of school zones because of student interest in the program(s) or instructional strategy. A choice program is a curricular area of emphasis that is open to any student wishing to participate. A choice school offers a unique school wide calendar, schedule, theme or approach that is open to any interested student.

In Leon County, as in many other districts, public school choice has been impacted by several factors. These include:

- A lack of capacity at several high performing schools and increasing underutilization at schools identified as less successful.
- Limited transportation due to a shortage of drivers and routes and state funding reimbursement that is less than the actual costs of services.
- Tight operating budgets that limit support for attractive magnet programs at underutilized, low performing and/or low SES schools.
- Class size reduction requirements that are progressively restrictive culminating in 2013-14 when individual classrooms are required to have 18 students for PK to grade 3, 22 students for grades 4 to 8, and 25 students for grades 9 to 12 in the core curricular courses.

Program Descriptions

Below is a synopsis of each program as it was made available in 2013-2014. There were 1,936 newly assigned students who participated in the Leon County Schools Choice Program for the 2013-2014 academic year. This is 5% of the entire district student population. Of these, more than 2/3 is attending under capacity schools or charter schools. This is a small indicator of success for the choice program.

Magnet Schools

Apalachee Tapestry Magnet Elementary School

This school offers unique opportunities for elementary students to pursue an interest in the arts, and the development of talents. The curriculum includes a variety of art classes and the infusion of arts into the core subjects. Discipline Based Arts Education concepts as well as visual arts, music, and drama are offered. A mentorship model, thematic orientation related to multiple intelligences, research based best teaching practices and current brain research is incorporated into the learning strategies. Students must apply for admission. For the 2013-2014 academic year, 22 students were newly reassigned to Apalachee for choice, compared to 25 in 2011-2012.

Sealey Applied Math and Science Magnet Elementary School

This school transforms the traditional science and math curricular into inquiry based learning experiences through the use of hands-on materials and technology. Field trips and high interest materials are designed to connect classroom learning to real life, encourage parent involvement and develop a close relationship with community partners. There are eight science themes included: The nature of matter, energy, force and motion, processes that shape the earth, earth and space, processes of life, how living things interact with their environment, and the nature of science. Mathematics at Sealey is a comprehensive program, combining the essential elements of computation, concepts and application. Students must apply for admission. For the 2013-14 academic year, 55 students were newly enrolled in the program, compared to 53 in 2011-2012.

Performing Arts Program (Raa Middle School)

The Performing Arts Magnet Program provides an enriching experience for students interested in instrumentation, choir, drama and dance. Students receive tailored instruction. Opportunities for extracurricular activities are provided through an alliance with the School of Music at FSU and other community partnerships. For the 2013-14 academic year, 58 students were newly enrolled in the program, compared to 112 in 2011-2012.

School for Applied and Individual Learning (SAIL) High School

Innovation, creativity and individual expression have been combined with high academic expectations to offer a creative alternative for high school students in Leon County. SAIL was founded on the belief that all students can learn and succeed when provided a learning environment that meets their needs and interests. The program is structured to foster development of positive self-concept, interpersonal relationships, and active learning. Classes are designed to help students make connections between academic concepts and the real world. Students must apply for admission. For the 2013-14 academic year, 389 students enrolled in SAIL, compared to 368 in 2011-2012.

Magnet Programs

Applied Science and Technology (Cobb Middle School)

Cobb Middle School, a LIFE (Laptop Initiative for Education) project school, offers a magnet program for Applied Science and Technology. Students can earn high school credit in: Algebra, Geometry, Integrated Science, Latin, and a scientific experimental inquiry class. Science, math and research classes are taught at an accelerated pace. Technology based activities using probeware and multimedia are infused throughout this advanced curriculum. For the 2013-14 academic year, 106 students were newly enrolled in the program, compared to 123 in 2011-2012.

Pre-International Baccalaureate Program (Fairview Middle School)

This program provides an advanced curriculum of studies and prepares students for a successful transition to the International Baccalaureate Program at Rickards High School or an Advanced Placement program at any high school. Students can earn up to four high school credits prior to entering ninth grade. The program offers acceleration in French and Spanish as well the five areas of interaction prescribed by the International Baccalaureate Organization. Students must apply for admission and meet program criteria. For the 2013-14 academic year, 127 students were newly enrolled in the program, compared to 127 in 2011-2012.

Pre-Information Technology Magnet Program (Griffin Middle School)

The Pre-Information Technology Magnet Program links core academic subjects to information technology and computer content. Students use cutting edge technology and receive advanced instruction not available at other middle schools. The program also prepares students to enter the IT

Program at Godby High. For 2011-12 school year, 2 students were newly assigned to Griffin for this choice program, compared to 5 for 2010-2011.

Academy of Finance (Godby High School)

The Academy of Finance provides hands-on experience, allowing students a unique opportunity for learning numerous aspects of finance. Students receive an integrated curriculum for achieving success in high school and prepare for specific jobs throughout the financial industry. For the 2013-14 academic year, 7 students were newly enrolled in the program, compared to 6 in 2011-2012.

Information Technology Career Academy (Godby High School)

The Information Technology Career Academy offers an honors-weighted integrated program, linking the core academic subjects to information technology and computer content. The program also prepares students to test for numerous industry certifications while still in high school. All programs use a four-pronged approach to education including curriculum integration, service learning, educational enriching field trips, and involvement in student organizations. For the 2013-14 academic year, 14 students were newly enrolled in the program, compared to 15 in 2011-2012.

International Baccalaureate (Rickards High School)

The IB Program is an academically challenging pre-university curriculum for which students may receive college credit. Students learn to analyze and reach considered conclusions about people, their languages and literature, their ways in society and the scientific forces of the environment. IB requires students to take advanced courses in six academic areas including Language A (English); Language B (Spanish, French, Latin); Mathematics, including Calculus; Sciences (Chemistry, Environmental Studies); History; and a variety of other subjects including Art and Psychology. In addition, students must complete Creativity, Action & Service hours, write a 4000 word research paper, and complete a philosophy-type course entitled Theory of Knowledge. Students who earn the IB Diploma receive an internationally recognized standard of attainment, acceptance and advanced placement in most universities and qualify for full Florida Academic Scholars Program. Students begin this program in the Pre-IB Program as freshmen and enter as full IB students in their junior year. For the 2013-14 academic year, 79 students were newly enrolled in the program, compared to 51 in 2011-2012.

Special Programs for Choice

Health Services (Rickards High School)

The health services program at Rickards is designed to attract students interested in a career in health services. Students must apply for admission. For the 2013-14 academic year, 2 students were newly enrolled in the program, compared to 1 in 2011-2012.

Other Choice Options

Documented Hardship

Students may be provided choice in cases of economic or financial hardship. Hardship is defined as documented economic/medical factors that are beyond the student's and parent/guardian's control which have a negative impact on the student's educational process, safety, mental health, or physical well-being. For the 2013-14 academic year, 396 students were newly enrolled in the program, compared to 489 in 2011-2012.

Grandfathering

Grandfathering is provided for the educational continuity of students. Students who have attended any school for at least one year because of either residence in the school's attendance zone or participation in a magnet or special program may request to continue to attend that school to complete the 4th, 5th, 8th, or 12th grade. Students attending under capacity elementary schools are allowed to grandfather all grades. Students must have attended said school for at least one year and there must be no evidence of having provided false information. For the 2013-14 academic year, 143 students were newly enrolled in the program, compared to 135 in 2011-2012.

Sibling Support

In order to keep families together and thus strengthen the family support system, a student may attend any school where their sibling (including stepsiblings and half siblings) is legally attending. For the 2013-14 academic year, 242 students were newly enrolled in the program, compared to 270 in 2011-2012.

LCS Employee

Parent/guardians who reside in the district and are employed not less than half time by the School Board at a district facility or parents/guardians who reside outside of the district but work full-time, may request that their child be allowed to attend a school of choice if space is available. For the 2013-14 academic year, 205 students were newly enrolled in the program, compared to 269 in 2011-2012.

Over/Under Capacity

Parents/guardians of students attending schools that are designated as over capacity by the district may request to attend schools that are designated as under capacity by the district, for any reason. For the 2011-12 academic year, 112 students were newly reassigned under this choice program, compared to 87 in 2010-2011.

ESE Programs

Parents or legal guardians of students with disabilities may choose another school if the needed program is offered at that school and space is available. Decisions regarding reassignment for ESE are made by the ESE Department. For the 2013-14 academic year, 5 students were newly enrolled in the program, compared to 27 in 2011-2012.

Leon County Virtual School

Leon County students enrolled in the Leon County Virtual School receive individualized instruction utilizing the Internet, email, telephone, instant messaging, online collaboration tools and face-to-face teacher forums. The virtual format allows flexibility of time and location, while promoting the skills and self-discipline for success in the 21st Century. Students may register for any course offered through Leon County Virtual School (contingent upon parent and guidance counselor approval). For the 2013-14 academic year, 33 students were newly enrolled in the program, compared to 25 in 2011-2012.

Ghazvini Learning Center (GLC)

The mission of GLC is to provide an effective learning environment that allows elementary, middle and high school students to experience behavioral success and to develop a desire for and experience academic success. We serve students unable to attend regular school because of problems with discipline, disruptive behaviors, failing grades, and/or involvement with the Juvenile Justice system. Students must apply for admission. For the 2013-14 academic year, 80 students were newly enrolled in the program, compared to 28 in 2011-2012.

The Success Academy at Ghazvini Learning Center

The Success Academy at Ghazvini Learning Center creates a unique and adaptable education environment that will meet student needs and aspirations allowing students to excel in the curriculum at an accelerated pace and to recover from academic deficiencies. The academy strives to assist

students in reaching their highest potential and achieving the goal of earning high school diplomas. They create partnerships between students, parents, community and the school. Through open lines of communication, they will promote the development of a community of life-long learners ready to be successful academically and professionally. For the 2013-14 academic year, 202 students were newly enrolled in the program, compared to 176 in 2011-2012.

Program Requirements

Although the district wants to provide every opportunity for students to participate in the choice programs offered by the district, there are some requirements:

- The application period for Choice is from January to March 1st each year. Choice for current students may be permitted after the deadline only for a documented economic or medical hardship.
- No school may lose more than a net of 5% of its current enrollment in any one year to choice options without School Board approval. First priority will be given to siblings, after which a random selection process will be used if more than 5% request to leave a school.
- Parent/guardians and adult students are responsible for ensuring the accuracy and timeliness of residential information. Students assigned to any public school based on false, incorrect or inaccurate information may be reassigned to the appropriate school or withdrawn to the correct district of residence.
- Students may ride any regular school bus to their school of choice if they get on and off at a designated scheduled stop. The parent/guardian must contact the Leon County Schools Transportation Department to coordinate this.
- Choice options shall be revoked for failure to meet attendance or discipline policy requirements. Students may be reassigned to their home zone school or other school as appropriate.

Woodville Elementary Magnet School

The focus of Woodville School Magnet Program is to develop student leadership through history and civic studies. The core subjects, as well as physical education and the arts, will be infused with essential elements of history, civics, and service learning. Our magnet supports academic excellence to prepare our students for the future, while honoring the past. For the 2013-14 academic year, 12 students were newly enrolled in the program.

Charter Choice

Students who currently attend a charter school or a developmental research school will have the opportunity to return to a traditional Leon County public school of your choice. You must provide your own transportation if you choose to attend a school that is not your home zone school. For the 2013-14 academic year, 256 students were newly enrolled in the program, compared to 36 in 2011-2012.
