What a great year for robotics in Tallahassee. We had 4 High and 3 Middle schools participate in the Underwater Robotics Chal-

lenge. We will continue to expand this opportunity out to more schools next year as the project continues to grow.

Last year we were contacted by a local organic gardener, Jeff Phipps, to build an autonomous weeding robot similar to a Roomba. With this start of a design we entered Lemelson-MIT's grant process and were awarded a \$8,000 grant to complete the project. We hope to be out weeding in the garden at SAIL in March. Currently we are in the middle of FIRST FRC robotics Build Season. The robot must be built in 45 days from the start of the design and is due February 17th. All our welcome to be with us on our final day at SAIL as we practice driving for competition.
