



## DISCIPLINE PLAN

### Class I Offenses

- 1.1 Gum and inappropriate items (toys, games, CD players, Radios, etc).
- 1.2 Class, lunchroom, hallway, or assembly disruption.
- 1.3 False information
- 1.4 Profanity/Inappropriate Comments
- 1.5 Illegal organization
- 1.6 Tardiness
- 1.7 Inappropriate display of affection
- 1.8 Entering school building before 9:30 a.m. and after 4:05 p.m.
- 1.9 Student to student verbal confrontation
- 2.0 Misuse of internet i.e. facebook, games, YouTube, music sites
- 2.1 Disrespect/not following instructions

### Class II Offenses

- 2.2 Skipping class, homeroom, or lunch
- 2.3 Failure to serve detention
- 2.4 Gambling
- 2.5 Threats, harassment of another student
- 2.6 Use of obscene manifestations towards another student
- 2.7 Stealing
- 2.8 Leaving school grounds without school authorization
- 2.9 Inappropriate use of the internet (media devices, cell phones, electronics)
- 2.10 Intimidation of another student

### Class III Offenses/Student Affairs

- 2.11 Possession of tobacco, use of tobacco, igniting matches and/or lighters etc.
- 2.12 Defiance
- 2.13 Directing obscene or profane language to a school board Employee
- 2.13 Group incident which causes school disruption
- 2.16 Threats, harassment or intimidation of a school board employee (depending on severity may result in expulsion)
- 2.17 Simple assault on a school board employee
- 2.18 Defacing/destruction of school property
- 2.19 Fighting (**3 fights will result in expulsion**)
- 2.20 Unprovoked attack/battery without second party retaliation (starts at step 2)
- 2.21 Confrontation with a LCSB employee (ex. refusing to give cell phone after several requests = 2 days OSS)
- 2.22 Removal of twist-ties will result in automatic days OSS
- 2.23 Possession and igniting fireworks

### Class I Consequences

5. Interventions not served 1 day ISD

### Class II Consequences

1. 1 day ISD
2. 2 days ISD
3. 3 days ISD
4. 2 days OSS
5. 3 days OSS
6. 5 days OSS
7. 10 days OSS (recommend expulsion)

### Class III Consequences

1. Referral, administrator/student conference and 2/3 days OSS
2. 5 days OSS
3. 10 days OSS (recommend expulsion)

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## **EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES**

If a student goes to ISS for the second time or is suspended out of school (OSS), anytime he/she will not participate in any extra-curricular activities for 10 school days, starting with the first day of suspension

Each time a referral is written, the administrator will conference with the student, contact a parent/guardian, and advise the student and parent of the next consequence.

If inappropriate and disruptive behavior continues after all parental assistance and available school and support services have been tried, a committee consisting of parent, student, teachers, administrators and school board representatives will meet to discuss an alternate educational program for the student. Continued disruptive behavior will not be tolerated and will result in suspension as outlined in the Leon County Code of Student Conduct.

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## **DRESS CODE**

Cleanliness, personal appearance, and proper dress are important in setting the pattern of school and social conduct. There is considerable evidence to indicate a close relationship between pupil dress and pupil behavior.

The Fairview dress code is designed to:

- promote safety and good hygiene
- prevent distractions from learning
- allow students to dress comfortably
- be easy to enforce

1. Students are to wear shoes at all times. Sandals should have a back. No bedroom slippers or flip flops should be worn or other footwear that is unsafe.
2. Clothing such as shorts and skirts must be worn not shorter than the end of the middle finger when the arm and hand are hung loosely at the side.
3. Halters, bare midriffs, tank tops, spaghetti straps and halters are not permitted. The shirt or blouse should cover the shoulder with at least **five inches** of material. No skin and no undergarments should be visible at any time.
4. Shirts, tops, dresses or blouses should not expose the bosom, chest, lower back or sides. If a jacket or sweater is worn over the top the shirt, blouse or dress underneath must still meet the dress code. See through materials, extremely tight clothing, beach wear, and sleepwear/pajamas are not appropriate for school dress. Students should not wear items of apparel that when worn together are usually indicative of gang membership. Students should not wear clothing that is obscene or promotes illegal activities, drugs, racism, alcohol, violence, tobacco products or sex on the school grounds or at school sponsored activities. Clothing cannot cause a disruption on campus
5. Hats, hoods, headgear, and sunglasses are not to be worn in the building after the bell rings for first period. They should not be carried during the day but stored in the locker or in a book bag. Those found/seen during the day will be confiscated. Curlers and combs should not be worn at school.
6. No holes, slits or tears in clothing *even* if skin is not showing
7. No leggings, No jeggings, No tights, No spandex, No yoga pants
8. No sagging – pants must be worn at the waist. No undergarments may be seen.

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## **CLASS III OFFENSES**

- 3.1 Controlled substances
- 3.2 Drugs, Alcohol, Marijuana, Other drugs (crack, speed, uppers, etc.).
- 3.3 Arson-purposeful burning of anything on school grounds.
- 3.4 Battery upon a school board employee-intentional touching, slapping, hitting, or shoving of an employee.
- 3.5 Robbery-taking of money or property by force, violence, assault or fear of assault.
- 3.6 Stealing or taking anything that does not belong to you valued at \$100 or more
- 3.7 Burglary, breaking and entering, or remaining inside school property without permission or authorization during the hours the premises are closed.
- 3.8 Criminal mischief-damage to property (public or personal) in excess of \$200.
- 3.9 Possession of a firearm-includes the firearm itself of any of its parts (frame, receiver, muffler, or silencer).
- 3.10 Discharging firearm
- 3.11 Possession of weapons-any knife, metallic knuckles, tear gas, gas chemical weapon or device, any other weapon, instrument or any other object with used with the intent to do harm.

- 3.12 Bomb threats
- 3.13 Explosives-preparing, possessing or igniting explosives
- 3.14 Sexual acts-acts of sexual nature including, but not limited to battery, intercourse, attempted rape or rape.
- 3.15 Aggravated battery-intentionally causing bodily harm, disability, permanent disfigurement, use of a deadly weapon
- 3.16 Inviting or participating in major student disorder leading encouraging and/or assisting in disruption which results in destruction.
- 3.17 Unjustified activation of fire alarm system or extinguishers
- 3.18 Miscellaneous violations: any offense which the administrator feels fits into this class of offenses including: vandalism and crimes in the community's administration.

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### **CLASSROOM PROCEDURE FOR CLASS III OFFENSES**

Students who commit a class III offense will escorted directly to the administrative office or the School Resource Officer (SRO).

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### **ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURE FOR CLASS III OFFENSES**

If infraction has not been documented on a referral, the administrator will write the referral. The school administrator and the School Resource Officer will work together to investigate the infraction.

#### **ANY CLASS III REFERRAL**

Minimum consequence is out of school suspension (OSS). Any act that would constitute a felony or misdemeanor as identified by Chapter 775, of the Florida Statutes, will be referred to the appropriate government authority, and action will be taken to suspend or expel the student from school pursuant to the suspension and expulsion procedures of this rule.
