- 2. Reactive Strategies Explore effective, respectful responses to interfering behaviors that prioritize safety, de-escalation, and relationship preservation.
- 3. Reinforcement Strategies Discover how to strengthen positive behaviors through meaningful reinforcement systems tailored to student needs.

Each rotation is designed to be interactive and solution-focused, providing participants with tools they can immediately apply in their settings.

To ensure relevance and impact, the training will be offered in two distinct tracks:

- **Primary Track** Tailored for early childhood and elementary educators, with strategies appropriate for younger learners.
- **Secondary Track** Designed for middle and high school staff, focusing on age-appropriate interventions and engagement techniques.
