
Croctoberfest is Just Around the Corner!

Parents, does your child struggle a bit academically and, perhaps, socially as well? Kate Sullivan has a team of mentors ready and willing to help!

Mentors are adult volunteers trained and backgroundchecked by Leon County Schools. Each one is matched with a student with whom they meet once each week for 30-60 minutes during the school day. Most mentors work with their students on reading but they can, also, help with other subjects and often with issues such as classroom behavior.

To be matched with a mentor a student must have a teacher's referral and a permission form signed by the parent or guardian.

Studies have shown that students who work with a mentor have improved grades and improved behavior. Many become classroom leaders and community volunteers themselves.
