






Applying to College





SUS Minimum Admissions Requirements

- ▶ 3.0 academic GPA plus SAT or ACT scores OR
- 2.5 -2.99 academic GPA and SAT CR 460, Math 460, Writing 440 or ACT Reading 19, Math 19, Writing 18
- Courses weighted 1pt for AP& DE and .5 pt for honors classes
- SUS GPA recomputed on academic courses at some; SUS GPA LHS weighted at others

- Science: 3 credits

Applying to a State University

SELF REPORTED ACADEMIC RECORD (SSAR)

SSAR will replace the high school transcript in the application process. While submitted separately from the application, the SSAR is required for the application to be complete. You must submit a complete and accurate SSAR so high school achievement can be properly accessed. Remember to adhere to deadline submission. An unofficial transcript is needed for completion; request unofficial transcript in guidance.

CARE Summer Bridge Program

Admission Advice

- Apply early!
- READ and SAVE all materials:
 - ► Tuition Deposit Deadlines
 - ► Housing Deposit
 - Orientation Deposit
 - Admission is based on satisfactory completion of senior year - CAN RESCIND ADMISSION for poor senior grades or dropped classes!



Community & State Colleges

- Of 28 Community Colleges 18 have become State Colleges that offer 4-year degrees in some programs
- Many of the Community Colleges offer degrees from partner universities (e.g. TCC has Flagler)
- They all have open enrollment (high school diploma required)





Community & State Colleges

Admission based on High School Diploma

PERT unless exempted by SAT/ACT scores

- ► SAT: 440 critical reading , 440 math
- ► ACT: 17 English, 18 reading, 19 math.

65% did not pass PERT or equivalent - must take remedial course, pay for it, not receive college credit

Students who take college prep courses in high school are more likely to be successful



Benefits of Community College

- Class size, costs, teachers
- Multiple degrees: AA, AS, Certificate
 AA guarantees admission to SUS with 60 credit hours and junior standing (must meet requirements for specific majors)
- ► TCC Honors Program 3.5 unweighted & 1240 SAT
- or 25 ACT

- > \$90 fee or fee waiver if student qualifies
- ▶ 16 core courses & test scores determine eligibility

Scholarship Program

Academic Scholars Award **

- 3.5 weighted GPA (only .25 weight) on the 16 required credits may use up to 2 additional credits in required subjects to raise GPA, and
- ▶ 1290 SAT (CR & M) or 29 ACT (New writing sections will not be used), and
- ▶ 100 hours of community service
- Covers 100% of tuition and fees;plus \$300 for additional educational expenses

Medallion Scholars Award **

- 3.0 weighted GPA (only .25 weight) on the 16 required courses may use up to 2 additional credits in required subjects to raise GPA, and
- 1170 SAT (CR& M) or 26 ACT (new writing sections will not be used)
- ▶ 75 hours of community service
- > \$77 cr hr 4 yr / \$63 cr hr comm. College




Academic & Medallion Coursework

- 4 English
- ▶ 4 Mathematics (Alg I, Geom & Alg II & higher)

(Liberal Arts Math & Informal Geom do NOT count)

- 3 Sciences
- 3 Social Studies (any)
- 2 World Language (in same language)
- ▶ 16 credits
- BF GPA IS NOT THE LHS GPA



Gold Seal Vocational Award

- ▶ 3.0 weighted GPA (only .25 weight) using the 16 credits required for graduation, and
- 3.5 unweighted GPA in a minimum of 3 sequential vocational credits, and
- Pass the PERT or SAT 440 CR & 440 math or ACT English 17, Reading 18, Math 19
- ▶ 30 hours of community service

 ONLY can be used for Career certificate & Applied Technology or Technical Programs



Applying for Bright Futures

- Seniors will go to the computer lab through govt./econ classes
- 7th semester evaluations
 - test scores through January
 - community service hours through Dec
- 8th semester
 - test scores through July
 - not to undo 7th semester award, CS by graduation
