<p><b><u>ABC Order</u></b>            Write your words in abc order using crayons, marker, or colored pencils. Circle your neatest word for each.</p>	<p><b><u>Spelling Flashcards</u></b>            Make flashcards of your words to help you study. Have your parents, brother, sister, or a friend quiz you.</p>	<p><b><u>Practice Test</u></b>            Take a practice spelling test and have a family member check your work.</p>
<p><b><u>Rainbow Words</u></b>            Use markers, colored pencils, or crayons to write all of your spelling words using three different colors at once.</p>	<p><b><u>Sporty Spelling</u></b>            Spell your words out loud while shooting hoops, jumping rope, or playing catch with a family member.</p>	<p><b><u>Hidden Picture</u></b>            Draw a picture. Hide your spelling words inside the picture. Remember to color your picture neatly.</p>
<p><b><u>Say and Write</u></b>            As you write each spelling word, say each letter of the word softly. Then say the word.            Ex: student → s-t-u-d-e-n-t</p>	<p><b><u>Pyramid Words</u></b>            Pyramid Write your words. You must write neatly!            Example: s                          sa                          sai                          said</p>	<p><b><u>Chalk Spelling</u></b>            Practice spelling your words by writing them outside with chalk. Show a family member your work.</p>
<p><b><u>Spelling Sentences</u></b>            Write a sentence for each word.</p>	<p><b><u>Syllable Spelling</u></b>            Write each spelling word as many times as there are syllables.</p>	<p><b><u>Red and Blue Spelling</u></b>            Write each word. Use red for vowels and blue for consonants.</p>
