












# Ourkiculum





**Z**= Means an activity is missing and your child can still make it up and turn it in for full credit.


**0% F**= Means your child has not completed the assignment within the 3 days for those in class or 10 days for those absent and will receive no credit.



review will be sent home before all tests.






## accelerated Reader


AR is our Reading Incentive program that helps to encourage independent reading and helps foster reading comprehension.


Students should be reading at least 20 minutes a night as part of their nightly homework to ensure they will reach their goal.




We will have nightly homework for third grade that helps students to achieve the third grade skills and standards being taught in class.
