

Conferences - We look forward to meeting with parents to discuss student progress. You will be notified when it is time to schedule individual conferences.





Purpose - Homework is designed to allow students to have independent practice, promote good study habits, and foster responsibility.

Procedure - Assignments will go home each Friday and are due the following Thursday. Incomplete assignments will not receive full credit.

Parent Involvement

Assignments

- *Reading Log 20 Minutes for at least 5 nights
- *Spelling Activity
- *Math practice and fluency
- *Reading Comprehension Worksheet
- *Study for spelling test (Fridays)
- *Other assignments as needed



ACCELERATED READER

Students select books based on their reading level (this is written at the top of their Weekly Progress Report or A.R. Log)

Students read books independently

Students take a comprehension test on the computer and earn points

Teachers monitor student progress and reward students

All students are expected to take at least two A.R. tests each week

Each child has an individual point goal with at least 85% accuracy

There are incentives for students meeting their goals each grading period

Students receive grades for their point goal and their accuracy, as 5% of his/her Language Arts grade.



WONDERS



Wonders is our Language Arts program that will help your child grow into a critical reader, writer, and thinker.

Assessments

- Vocabulary and Selection Assessments
- Spelling Tests
- Fresh Read Assessment reflect the skills and strategies taught through 2 "Fresh Read Stories". Each story has multiple choice, fill in the blank, and written response questions.
