Springwood Uniform Policy & Procedures Outline

Students will abide by the following Dress Code Guidelines for the 2022-2023 school year. In an effort to get 100% participation, all students and families will have until Labor Day to secure appropriate clothing before infraction notices and consequences are implemented. Please not that embroidery is **NOT** required for any items. Students enrolling after the 1st day of school will have 4 weeks to obtain uniforms.

Top:

- Students would be required to wear a collard polo shirt (short or long sleeves) in one of the following colors: Navy Blue, Light Blue, Turquoise/Teal, Gray, White, or Black.
- Students may wear their school purchased t-shirt (or any previous Springwood shirt, or college/university shirt) on Fridays and for other announced special events.

Bottoms:

- Students would be required to wear bottoms (shorts, skirts, jumpers, dressed, or pants) in one of the following colors: Khaki, Black or Navy Blue (must be at least knee length or longer and cannot sag below the waist).
- Students may wear regular blue jeans without holes on Fridays and other announced special events with their school shirt, previous Springwood shirt, or a top as outlined above. No other shirts are allowed. Leggings are not allowed in lieu of jeans.

Cardigans/Jackets/Sweaters:

- Students can wear cardigans, jackets, or blazers, or sweaters in the same colors: Navy Blue, Light Blue, Turquoise, Teal, Gray, White, or Black.
- Students can wear solid colors in pullovers and hoodies.
- No other colors are allowed. **Hoods are not allowed on your head once you are on campus in the building.**

Shoes: Students must wear closed toe shoes. No sandals or open-toed shoes are allowed.

Hair: Students are to maintain natural hair color. Hair dyed in multicolor is not allowed.

Students' apparel and grooming shall be the responsibility of the individual and his/her parents/ guardian within the following guidelines: Dress and grooming, shall be in keeping with health, sanitary, and safety requirement; make-up and perfume are strongly discouraged for students. Dress and grooming shall not be permitted to disrupt the teaching and learning process or school activity.
