

# READING FLUENCY



### ECHO READ

You read a sentence (or phrase) and your child reads the same thing after you. This gives your child a model of how the sentence should be read by a fluent reader.




### POETRY

Reading poetry aloud can make reading fun! It also promotes reading with inflection. Look for poems by fun children's authors like Shel Silverstein or Jack Prelutsky.



### REPEATED READING

Although it may seem tedious, rereading the same text multiple times can help increase fluency. This is best done with shorter stories, poems, or other texts.



### FUNNY VOICES

To make repeated reading more fun, have your child use a different silly voice for each reading! *Example voices: robot, country, mouse, grumpy, deep, etc...*



### RECORD IT

Using a cellphone or tablet, record your child reading. Listening to yourself read is a great way to hear how much you are improving.



### LISTEN

Listening to audio books, YouTube videos of books being read, or even family members reading can even help improve your child's fluency. Good models make good readers!
