


Fairview Middle School Dress Code for the School Year 2020-2021




In an attempt to accommodate our students and assist our families prior to going shopping for the new school year, while maintaining adequate and appropriate uniformity, the following Dress Code applies for the entire school year.

The school's dress code is designed to facilitate an environment where the school pursues its purpose of providing students an education based on academic excellence while ensuring safety, limiting distractions, and keeping the focus on learning. The cooperation of the student and the parent is necessary in maintaining the standards of the school's dress code and dress code violations may result in appropriate disciplinary action. Coming to school each day with clothing in compliance with the dress code is a responsibility of both the student and the parent. The following information is intended to clarify the School Advisory Council approved FMS Dress Code and should be used as a guide. Shoes

- Shoes must have a back strap.
- Shoes must have a sole.
- Shoes are to be worn at all times.
- Shoes with laces are to be laced at all times.
- No bedroom slippers/house shoes.
- No slides/shower shoes.



DRESS CODE

- 1. Students <u>MAY NOT</u> wear head coverings including, but not limited to: caps, hats, hoods, or scarves in the building (but may be permitted outside). Bandanas are prohibited for all students.
- 2. Students <u>MAY NOT</u> wear clothing that is sexually suggestive or that features crude or vulgar messages; depicts drugs, tobacco, alcoholic beverages, violence, racial/ethnic clubs or gang affiliation in words, pictures or colors.
- 3. All pants and shorts are to be worn at the waist level with a belt (if necessary), with **NO** undergarments or other shorts showing. (This is now state law).
- 4. Dresses, skirts, shorts, etc., are to be of appropriate length (with arms extended at your side, clothing must be longer than fingertips), with a finished hem, worn at the waist with NO undergarments showing.
- 5. Shirts must cover the chest, back and shoulders (no tank tops or spaghetti straps) and MAY NOT expose the midriff or bare sides including when arms are extended above the head.
- 6. Students <u>MAY NOT</u> wear see-through clothing or spandex-type clothing without something underneath or over. This includes but is not limited to: tights, leggings, Jeggings as pants. In the event a secondary garment is worn over, the garment must be finger-tip length with the arms extended downward at one's sides.
- 7. Pajamas/sleepwear/bedroom clothes/clothing designed after sleepwear are prohibited.
- 8. Clothing containing rips, cuts, tears, or holes, even when decoratively embroidered or when skin or undergarments cannot be seen.
- 9. Shoes must have, at a minimum, a back secure strap and proper soles and are to be worn at all times. Shoes may not be bedroom slippers, house shoes slides, shower shoes, or open back shoes. Shoes with laces are to be laced at all times.
- 10. Students must wear their Student I.D. w/ their lanyard at all times.

11. Covid-19 Dress Code Procedures

- o Mask designs must not contain any derogatory images or profane language
- o Masks containing any bandana designs are prohibited

Examples of inappropriate clothing include bicycle racing attire, see through garments, halters, backless dresses, tube tops or tank tops, clothing not properly fastened, and bare midriff outfits.

- Clothing, jewelry, buttons or any other items with profanity or with symbols, pictures, patches, and/or signs, which are indecent, offensive, suggestive, drug and alcohol-related or associated with gangs are inappropriate. Clothing, identifying markings, or paraphernalia, which are racially or religiously offensive, including those associated with gangs, clubs, sects, or groups avowing or practicing discrimination against any person on the basis of age, ethnicity, handicapping, condition, religious, sex, or sexual orientation are inappropriate.
- Curlers, other hair and grooming aids, including nail polish and make up, should be used in restrooms only. Sunglasses must be removed in class.

The final decision on dress code will rest with the Administration. Students in violation of the dress code will be required to bring their dress into compliance, and repeat violators may face other disciplinary consequences.

CONSEQUENCES FOR INFRACTIONS

*For any infraction so egregious that is deemed a disruption to the learning environment, the student will be removed from the classroom and escorted to OFI so that they can call a parent to be supplied with appropriate attire or to remain for the duration of the day in OFI.

Dress Code infractions are cumulative and are posted to FOCUS. Warnings do not have to be issued by the same teacher and one a third dress code card has been issued by any teacher, the extent of consequences will extend past warning cards.

1 st Violation: Warning	(Dress Code Card must be provided, & documented in FOCUS)
2 nd Violation: Parent Contact/Conference	(Dress Code Card, documented in FOCUS, parent contacted by teacher)
3 rd Violation: Teacher Consequence	(Dress Code Card, documented in FOCUS, parent contacted by teacher, detention)
4 th Violation: Referral – 1 Day OFI	(Office Referral written with list of infractions) (not necessary if prior infraction are posted in FOCUS)
5 th Violation: Referral – 2 Days OFI	(Office Referral written with list of infractions)
6 th and Subsequent Violations:	(Office Referral for Defiance is written OSS assigned)

This is not an all-inclusive list. Administrative discretion will apply in some cases.

This dress code is subject to revision and updating at any time throughout the school year at the discretion of administration.
