#### **Award History**

#### Glenn-Howell Distinguished Educator of the Year

This award is named for Devurn Glenn, Ph.D. and Aquilina C. Howell, both retired educators. Dr. Glenn for whom the *Devurn Glenn District Office Complex* at 2757 W. Pensacola Street is named, was a classroom teacher, school- level administrator and District-level administrator. He served as the first African American Assistant Superintendent of Schools for Personnel for the Leon County School District. Mrs. Howell, "Aquilina" as she was affectionately called and for whom the Aquilina C. Howell Instructional Service Center at 3955 W. Pensacola Street is named, was a classroom teacher and guidance counselor. She held District-level positions as supervisor of guidance, secondary education supervisor, and director of secondary education. She was appointed the first female African American Assistant Superintendent of Schools for Instruction for the Leon County School District. During their careers, both of these fine educators touched the lives of thousands of young people and adults alike. They were faithful, committed, and dedicated to serving this school District and the greater Tallahassee community. This District is pleased to recognize them as outstanding role models. Mrs. Howell passed away on January 21, 2000.

For many years, the Florida Department of Education conducted the Ida S. Baker Distinguished Minority Educator Award as a statewide recognition. When it was discontinued in the late 1990s, then-Superintendent William J. Montford felt it important to continue this process as a local recognition supported by the Leon County School District. The founding chairperson of this award was Dr. Malinda W. Jackson-James.

#### School Related Employee of the Year

This program recognizes outstanding education support personnel for the significant contributions they make to their schools and district school systems. The program honors one state representative and four finalists. In accordance with Florida Statute section 1012.21(5), the bureau provides coordination and technical assistance in the nomination, selection, and recognition processes.

Nomination packets are sent to district superintendents at the beginning of each school year. Selection processes may differ by district. Only one nomination may be submitted by a district to the state and only the superintendent may make the nomination.

All non-certified, non-instructional educational support personnel who serve at the school or district level (such as teacher aides, library aides, bookkeepers, secretaries and clerks, bus drivers, food service staff, custodians, building maintenance workers, warehouse workers, mechanics, nurses, and office managers) may be nominated. Nominees may be full-time or part-time employees. Instructional and administrative personnel as defined in Section 1012.01(2) (a) - (d) and (3). Certified administrative staff and contract employees are not eligible.

#### Teacher of the Year

The Leon County Schools Teacher of the Year recognition program has been in place since 1968. For 54 years, Leon County Schools has been honoring one teacher that represents the best of what teaching is all about. This program recognizes and honors the contributions of outstanding classroom teachers who have demonstrated a superior capacity to inspire a love of learning in students of all backgrounds and abilities. Each year, individual schools across the District honor one of their teachers as the school's Teacher of the Year. These teachers are entered into the Leon County Schools Teacher of the Year program. The top five teachers in the District are then interviewed by a District-based committee composed of past Teachers of the Year, District administrators, parent leaders, and community members who select the winner. Leon County Schools has more than 2,000 teachers and its highest honor is to be named Teacher of the Year.

#### **Volunteer - Mentors - Partners For Excellence**

The Leon County Schools Volunteer Program has been in existence for over five decades and was started in 1969 at Timberlane Elementary School (present day Gilchrist Elementary School). Volunteer have been enriching and shaping the future by sharing their gifts of time and talents with the students of Leon County Schools.

The Leon County Schools Mentor Program began in 1985 and was initially called Tutor Train. The program began at Gilchrist Elementary School. Mentors serve at least one semester and work one-on-one with students each week.

The Outstanding School Volunteer Award is presented annually to Volunteer who have shown outstanding dedication and commitment to quality education in Leon County Schools The Outstanding School Volunteer award recognizes Volunteer in the following categories: youth, adult, senior, and mentor. A selection committee chooses the winner from each category based on a review of redacted nominations.

The Partners for Excellence Program began in 1984 and links businesses, agencies, organizations, and higher education institutions together with local schools. Business Partners greatly enhance the learning environments in schools by providing donations of volunteer time, goods and services, or monetary contributions.

The Partners for Excellence Award began in 2007 and recognizes exemplary business Partners. The award recognizes nominees in the following categories: Large Business, Small Business, and Government Agencies/Non-Profit Organizations.

#### **STATEMENTOFNOMINATION**

It is a distinct pleasure to provide a Statement of Nomination for Baleasa Hill; our 2021-22 Glenn Howell Distinguished Educator of the Year. The depth and breadth of Baleasa's commitment and service to the Oak Ridge Community is both extraordinary and expansive.

I am a firm believer that things happen in your life at just the right time and just the right moment. Baleasa Hill joined the Oak Ridge family during a time in which was tremendously difficult for us as a school family. I had just completed my first year as Principal at Oak Ridge and was trying to recover from earning a school grade of D (the school's third consecutive D) and preparing myself and my staff or all that would come as we were faced with improvement for the 2018-19 school year or possible school closure.

During a time that was the most critical in my career as I led a school and community that was literally facing school closure, I found my-self facing weekly DOE visits, lowered morale, 55% teacher turnover rate, and to top it off tremendously low Reading proficiency rates. It was decided that we would have both a Primary and Intermediate Reading Coach so that we could better serve the needs of our school community. When I met Baleasa, she had been serving as a first-grade teacher at Riley Elementary School and her resume and work to support early learning was exceptional. It became immediately evident in our interview that Baleasa was the perfect person for the Primary Reading Coach position at Oak Ridge, but it was also immediately evident that she believed in the power of having high expectations for children and finding any way possible to ensure that they met them.

Baleasa joined our team as a Reading Coach and immediately began to bond with both the students and staff. It was as if she had been there the entire time that I had been at the school. Under her leadership and guidance, we created what became known as the Epic Book Club. Baleasa formed a book club for some of our 2nd grade students that were proficient and on the cusp of being proficient readers with the hopes that working with them during the summer would help them to not experience summer learning loss. Each student in the book club was given a device to use which gave them access to over 30,000 book titles. She created a required book list and met with the students to discuss the books. What we experienced that summer was nothing short of amazing. Over the course of the summer, ten students read thousands of books. We realized at that moment how impactful access was for our school community. This was in 2019, well before we went 1:1 as a school district.

This is just one of many examples of how Baleasa has positively impacted our school community. She currently serves as the Sponsor for both our Girl Scout Troop and our 100 Girls of Code Club. She meets with these students on weekends and organizes and facilitates innovative and engaging activities for them. She also leads Intervention Groups, models for teachers, monitors data regularly, and organizes and implements our Accelerated Reader Program. Under her guidance, our percentage of students making their AR goal has doubled and there is visible excitement about reading in the building. And even during Covid, our Learning Gains for our Lowest Quartile students increased from the 2018-19 school year by nearly ten percent. That is a testament to the fact that there are no quick fixes with Baleasa. There is just true knowledge of the Science of Reading and even greater commitment to ensuring that our students meet their highest potential.

I don't know if I can accurately capture on paper all that Baleasa has given to Oak Ridge and how honored I am to have the opportunity to work with her. As a principal, I have learned so much from her and have great respect for her work. Leon County Schools could not honestly select a better person as our 2022 District Glenn Howell Distinguished Educator of the Year. In closing, I highly support Baleasa Hill's nomination. 

Dear Teacher of the Year Nominating Committee,

I am so pleased to write this letter of nomination for Pineview Elementary School's Teacher of the Year winner, Ashlyn Laughlin. Without a doubt, Ms. Laughlin exemplifies the qualities and attributes that will leave the selection committee with no other choice other than selecting her as Leon County School's Teacher of the Year!

To better acquaint you with Ms. Laughlin, please allow me to describe exactly how wonderful she is! Immediately after graduating from college she started her teaching career here at Pineview Elementary "by choice". Her desire to want to make a difference in a school that was deemed failing (at the time) ignited a fire not only within herself, but also amongst her teammates. She brought on a new perspective of teaching that brought forth new experiences for our students. Under her tutelage, all of our kindergartners now have the opportunity to complete hands-on learning practices that have now become "kindergarten staples".

Moreover, even amid the many barriers that exist in a Title I school, she sets high standards for herself and her students. Take for example the level of growth that she made with her students within the past nine weeks, from the beginning of the year baseline assessments to the end of the first nine weeks her class went from 20% to 62% of her students being at or above grade level. She achieves such greatness in such a short period of time with intentional acts that directly impact her students and their learning. This level of accelerated growth is attained through adding minutes to her daily instruction and providing deliberate practice segments throughout the school day. Over the past two years, she has perfected her delivery of instruction and her students' data is evidence of how tailored instruction can meet the needs of students and place them on the road to proficiency.

Additionally, she devotes time outside of her regular work day to develop skills with our lowest performing students in kindergarten. This two-year venture has been the key to bridging the gap of learning loss of our kindergarteners that came to us without any prior schooling experience. This extra layer of learning has changed the trajectory of students learning and has gotten most on grade level before the end of the school year.

Ms. Laughlin is an amazing teacher and has built a sturdy foundation for which her students will thrive upon as they matriculate through school. Because of her, her students and our kindergarten program will produce some of the best prepared students in Leon County Schools! For this reason alone, she should be the district winner for Teacher of the Year.


