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

Career Dual Enrollment (CDE) is an option for high school students to enroll in post-secondary courses to earn elective credit toward high school graduation requirements and to receive hours toward a career and technical post-secondary program certificate.

For the current academic year, 292 LCS high school students are in a career-dual enrollment program either on their high school campus or at Lively's main campus.

## **CAPE Act**

In 2007, the Florida Legislature passed the Career and Professional Education Act. The purpose of the act was to provide a statewide planning partnership between the business and education communities in order to attract, expand, and retain targeted, high-value industry and to sustain a strong, knowledge-based economy. The objectives of the act are as follows:

- To improve middle and high school academic performance by providing rigorous and relevant curriculum opportunities;
- To provide rigorous and relevant career-themed courses that articulate to postsecondary level coursework and lead to industry certification;
- To support local and regional economic development;
- To respond to Florida's critical workforce needs; and
- To provide state residents with access to high-wage and high-demand careers

### **CAPE Act**

The key feature of the CAPE Act is the list of approved certifications known as the "CAPE Industry Certification Funding List," which is the list of fundable industry certifications adopted by the State Board of Education.

Type of Certification of Certificate	Description
CAPE Digital Tool Certificates (Grades K-8)	To earn a certificate, students must pass an assessment of digital skills in the following areas: word processing; spreadsheets; sound, motion and color presentations; digital arts; cybersecurity. The certificates are available to students in elementary school and middle school grades.
CAPE Industry Certifications (Grades 6-12)	These are industry certifications that either do not articulate for college credit or do articulate for up to 14 college credits based on a statewide articulation agreement. The certifications are available to students in grades 6 through 12.
CAPE Acceleration Industry Certifications	These are industry certifications that articulate for 15 or more college credit credits based on a statewide articulation agreement.

# **Programs of Study**

The Division of Career and Adult Education is responsible for developing educational programs that prepare individuals for the occupations that are important to Florida's economic development. Per F.S. §1004.92(2)(b)(4), each program is updated every three (3) years to reflect current business and industry needs specific to the occupation for which it prepares. With the help of educators, business and industry representatives, and trade associations, career and adult education programs are aligned with the skill requirements needed in today's workforce.

A program of study is a coherent, articulated sequence of rigorous academic and career courses commencing in the 9th grade (or sometimes earlier) leading to an associate degree, an industry-recognized certification or licensure, and/or a baccalaureate degree.

## **Career Dual Enrollment**

Career Dual Enrollment (CDE) is an option for high school students to enroll in post-secondary courses to earn elective credit toward high school graduation requirements and to receive hours toward a career and technical post-secondary program certificate.

CDE includes courses offered through career certificate (clock hour) programs and career associate degree programs (e.g., Associate of Science). The high school credits are awarded upon completion of the postsecondary course.

For Career Certificate clock hour courses taken through dual enrollment, the following methodology must be used for the awarding of high school credits: 0.5 high school credit for each 75 hours in the course rounded down to the nearest 0.5 credit.

Lively Technical College (LTC) offers CDE options on high school campuses and on the main LTC campus.

#### Soft Skills Credential:

The new Florida Soft Skills solution features highly interactive digital training focused on in-demand employability skills including conveying professionalism, communicating effectively, teamwork and collaboration, and thinking critically and solving problems.

#### **Employability Skills Credential:**

Work Ready Math Work Ready Reading Work Ready Data



To earn the **Florida Ready to Work Credential**, participants must pass three, one-hour proctored assessments validating mastery of foundational workplace math, reading, and data analysis skills.

There are four Achievement Levels that correlate with the U.S. Department of Labor O\*NET Job Zones 2-3-4-5, the nation's primary source of occupational data. The levels build on each other with each higher level indicating readiness for more jobs.

Those who pass the three assessments earn the Florida Ready to Work Credential which is issued by the State of Florida and signed by the Governor.

Nursing assistants provide basic bedside care and comfort to patients and residents in multiple healthcare setting. The Nursing Assistant program prepares students for employment in long-term care, hospitals, home health care and other health care facilities.



#### Summer Phlebotomy Program

> Students will earn 1.5 high school credits: Basic Healthcare Worker (HSC0003) (1 credit) Phlebotomist (MEA0520) (.5 credit)

Courses are offered through dual enrollment with Lively Technical College. Courses are weighted at the AP level.

Phlebotomists are employed in blood banks, hospitals, clinics and other medical facilities drawing blood from patients in preparation for medical testing. The program focuses on the skills and knowledge necessary to gain employment as a Phlebotomy Technician in a healthcare facility.

The healthcare field is a growing industry, and being a part of that field includes caring for people and their health. Phlebotomy can also be the first step as a health care professional.

Upon successful completion of the Phlebotomy Technician program, students will be prepared to sit for the required examination before the National Healthcare Association and begin the search for employment within the industry.

Our course curriculum includes textbook lecture and in-depth instruction in the following areas:

- Necessary skills required to perform venipuncture
- Safety and infection control
- Patient communication and education
- Law and ethics
- Transitioning from Student to Employee
