- V. Approval of Agenda: Cheryl Collier-Brown motioned to approve the December 5, 2024, agenda, which Demaris Barrios seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.
- VI. Approval of Minutes: Cheryl Collier-Brown moved to approve the November 7, 2024, minutes, which Nate Wienert seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.
- VII. Public Infrastructure: Hawks Rise and Springwood Joe Sisk & Jenna Duncan presented-Safe Routes to Schools- a Federally and Locally funded program. This is a growing movement throughout the US to motivate students to walk and ride their bikes to school. This program removes barriers like missing sidewalks or safe routes to walk and ride to school. Local



municipalities across the state of Florida submit applications to FDOT Safe Routes to School (SRTS), and if approved, the projects are funded by FDOT in the five-year work program. You can support this program by scheduling school walking/biking events during school hours. Applications from 2022 are being resubmitted for Hawks Rise (Heritage Ridge Road) and Springwood Elementary (North Settlers Blvd). Charles Wu (606-1549) is the contact who can assist with county sidewalks for roads around rural schools such as Woodville, Chaires, etc.

- VIII. Family Resource Center: Deondra Williams, Ivory Miller, and Ashley Leland presented- The Cross-Creek Family Resource Center is a one-stop location for resume assistance, job applications, counseling, etc, to connect individuals with people who can assist them in the areas in need. The center is at 2002 Old St. Augustine Road, Bldg A, Suite 50. There is a computer lab for job applications, etc. Students can apply for housing vouchers, work on school work on the computers, find tutors for students, Healing Hearts (M 11-11:30), etc. Please reach out if you are at a school location and know of students or families who might be in need. Everything at the center is free. If you would like to volunteer, please stop by or reach out. Funded by the Children's Service Council. The center is open on Monday & Wednesday, 9 am-5 pm; Tuesday, 10 am-6 pm; Thursday, 10 am-5 pm; Friday, 9 am-2 pm; and the second Saturday of each month, 9 am-4 pm.
- IX. LCS Volunteer & Mentor Programs: Kelli Walker presented- walker@leonschools.net 850-487-7800 The LCS Volunteer program began in 1969 with just 12 volunteers. There are so many ways to volunteer! First, complete the online volunteer form. You must complete this each new school year. Volunteers can serve in an academic capacity, such as assisting in the library, judging an academic competition, etc. This is a level 1 clearance to check all 50 states for any sexual assault/harassment. Mentoring occurs on LCS property, so all mentors are fingerprinted through LCS, and the county pays for the fingerprinting costs. Each mentor is assigned one student for at least a semester. We set a district record in 2023-2024 with 19,249 registered volunteers. During the 2023-2024 school year, 139,417.50 volunteer hours and 15 133.50 mentor hours were logged. This came to a total of 154,551 hours. According to the Independent Sector, volunteer hours are worth \$31.61 per hour. This was a total value of community involvement of \$4,885,357.11. The total value of community involvement equates to 74 people working for free for the district. If you know anyone who can spare 30-45 minutes per week, please get in touch with Kelli to get started with the mentor program.
- X. Adult & Community Education: Regina Browning presented- Two locations in Tallahassee and online. ACE has four main programs- GED Prep, Adult High School, Co-enrollment, and ESOL. ACE is "A Great Start for a Better Future" and a stepping stone to post-secondary education, the workforce, or the military. Tuition is \$31.50 per semester, is part of the LCS framework, and utilizes the same calendar. You can apply online. ESOL and other programs accept students from 16 years old. You can take the GED at Ace by registering online at www.ged.com. Career Pathways



Advisor is available on campus to all students. Integrated Education and Training (IET) program. The City of Tallahassee TEMPO for ages 16-24, which pays for tuition, GED study guide, and testing. FAMU Trio is for students of any age and pays for testing only. Career source Capital Region is for anyone of any age and assists with testing as needed. Leon County Schools graduation coach Teresa Dennis assists those aged 16-18 with paying for tuition, GED study guide, and testing.

- School Choice 2024-2025: Jamie Holleman presented The School Choice Application is only XI. available through the Focus Parent Portal. Parents who do not have a Parent Portal account but wish to submit a School Choice Application must register for an account. If your children ARE NOT SHOWING in YOUR portal: Are your children currently enrolled in LCS or WERE previously enrolled in LCS (including charter, home school, private testing, PK Screening, or received state scholarship funding)? DO NOT create an online application. Contact your school or focushelp@leonschools.net to add your child to YOUR portal. Are the students BRAND NEW to the district (FIRST TIME)? If so, complete the ONLINE ENROLLMENT with FULL LEGAL NAME and REQUIRED DOCUMENTS- Submit and FINISH to complete the application before you can complete the school choice application. When submitting for multiple children, complete the form for each child by clicking "Save" and then selecting the next child, etc. Parents applying for Sibling Support must enter the student's name in the sibling list at the bottom of the application to be considered for Sibling Support. Parents make the appropriate selections for various statuses, such as Active Military, Special Circumstances, etc. Do not include each description, and include all supporting documentation by using the file upload at the bottom of the screen. Parents may select up to 3 program choices. After applying, parents will receive a confirmation email. Once you are approved for school choice, with good attendance and good behavior, you can stay at the same school if you would like.
