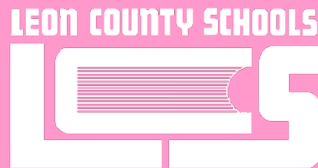

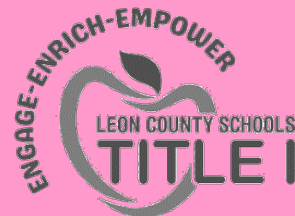

What is Title I

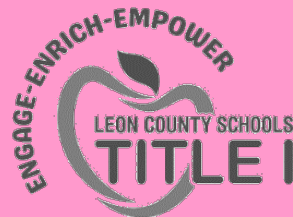
Title I is a federally funded program that provides funds to schools serving high numbers of economically disadvantaged children. Funding for this program is based on the percentage of students attending each school who qualify for free or reduced lunch. The goal is to support schools by providing resources and effective strategies to increase student achievement.



Title I Purpose

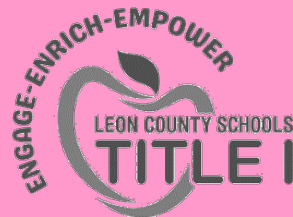
The purpose of Title I funding is to provide economically disadvantaged students significant opportunity to receive a fair, equitable and high-quality education and to close educational achievement gaps.

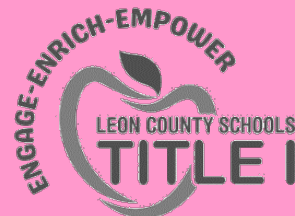

Title I : Federal Grant Programs Recipients

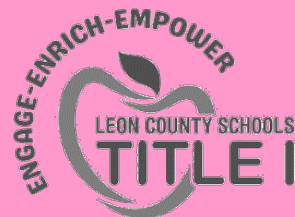

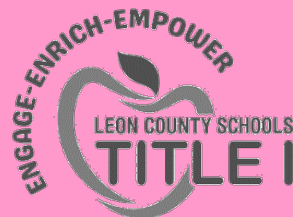


Requested Budget

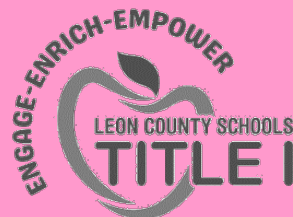

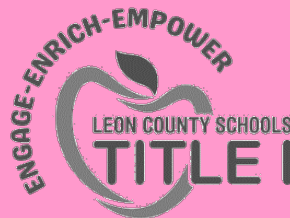

LCS Title I School Spotlight
 Bond Elementary School




Bond Elementary School achieved a "B" as determined by the Florida Department of Education's Accountability System during the 2021-2022 school year! According to the state's report card, Bond achieved the following:

- Increased 14% in ELA achievement on the FSA ELA;
- Increased 19% in ELA learning gains on the FSA ELA;
- Increased 13% in ELA learning gains of the lowest 25% on the FSA ELA;
- Increased 19% in mathematics achievement on the FSA Math;
- Increased 28% in mathematics learning gains on the FSA Math;
- Increased 9% in mathematics learning gains of the lowest 25% on the FSA Math; and
- Increased 10% in science achievement on the FCAT 2.0 Science

Bond Elementary School will continue to align curriculum, instruction, assessments, and improvement via a systematic addition, teachers will continue to target instruction that focuses on data-informed interventions and/or and provide varied extended learning opportunities to meet the needs of its students.

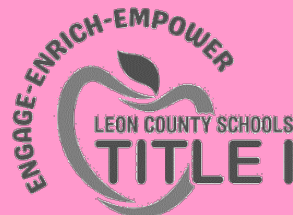
