# Purpose

## IMPROVING THE ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT OF THE DISADVANTAGED

**Title I, Part A**, provides resources that help children gain a high-quality education and the skills to master the Florida Standards. Title I provides additional resources to schools with economically disadvantaged students.

## Base Allocation- Economically Disadvantage Rate

### Funding Distribution/Expenditures/Needs Assessment

- Consultation-Schools develop a comprehensive needs assessment and plan
- Allowable vs Unallowable Expenses
- Private School Proportionate Share
- Set-Asides (Homeless, Neglected & Delinquent, Foster Care, Early Childhood)
- Parent & Family Engagement 2%
- Administrative Cost 10% (i.e. salaries, educational resources for schools, professional development, indirect cost-contract, etc.)

Carry Forward \$2,734,679

Total \$14,614,159

## Carryforward- Unspent Funds

- Unspent funds from public, charter, and private schools.
- Examples-salary, benefits, contracted services
