Financial Literacy

Who knew that learning about financial literacy could be fun! The Title I Office and Envision Credit Union teamed up to provide a financial literacy workshop for families. Parents were able to engage with tools to help manage budgets and prioritize spending . Thanks to Mr. Russell, parents learned the "50/30/20 Budget Rule." Parents walked away with a greater understanding of the importance of budgeting and how to stick to a budget. Mrs. Merck helped students to distinguish between needs and wants when budgeting. By the end of the workshop, students realized that things they considered needs were actually wants. Thank you to principal, Dr. Cassandra Poole, and the Astoria Park Panthers for sharing your campus! This event is one way to support financial independence.



Dads Take Your Child to School

The Title I Office hosted "Dads Take Your Child to School Day: A Round Table Discussion" at Fairview Middle School. This event highlighted the important role fathers and father figures play in shaping the lives of children. Guest panelists were: Alphonso Dorsey, Royle King, Todd Lanter, Dr. Chris Small, Chris Warfel, and Gerald Williams. Our moderator for the evening was Brian Jackson, news anchor for WTXL ABC 27. Dads taking their child to school is more than the physical activity. Panelists shared the importance of being an active participant with their child and encouraging the value of education. Each dad took home tools to add to their dad toolbox. One of those tools was the Conversation Starters – things to ask instead of "How was school today?" Many of our schools also hosted events to highlight and showcase fathers and father figures at their site.

Mobile STEM Labs

The Title I Office partnered with Florida A & M University's College of Agriculture and Food Science to present Mobile STEM Lab sessions. The students from Sealey and Pineview had a STEM-tastic time during their Mobile STEM Labs. After learning about density, families were tasked with assembling an ocean robot and making sure that their robot floated. Each family completed a mission that landed them in a place far away from Tallahassee! To get there, they practiced balancing their robot by adding weight to create the sinking and floating behavior. Families were able to modify the weight and retest their robots.



Parent Engagement Training





The Title I Office hosted district-wide training for all Title I administrators, faculty, and staff. This training provided attendees with an overview of Title I programs and ways to support parent engagement.

School-level parent liaisons enhanced their knowledge of increasing parent engagement through business partnerships and best practices. Eric Clark, Director of the Foundation for Leon County Schools, shared the importance and benefits of partnering with local businesses. Javon Austin, Family and Community Engagement Coordinator of the Children's Home Society, shared best practices to increase and sustain parent engagement.

The district Parent and Family Engagement Plan, deliverables, and evaluations were also reviewed.


<u>Title I & Title IV Team Up</u> for Science



Title IV expanded its STEAM initiative this year by purchasing STEAM carts for Title I schools. On the cart is a 3D Printer, document camera, microscopes (for both elementary and secondary age students), a small group set of iPads, and Scratch JR. Coding Cards for elementary schools. Teachers will be trained to use the cart and items provided. As another part of the STEAM initiative, Title IV expanded the STEAM Library. Teachers will soon be able to search the database and request STEAM kits that are both low tech (building items) and high tech (Robotics kits).

PARENT CORNER

TIPS FOR SUCCESS



Do regular backpack audits: Schedule a time each week for your child/ren to clean out and organize their backpack. Stress that the backpack is an important piece in home school communication.

Ask for help: Take advantage of afterschool programs.

PARENT PORTAL: REPORT CARDS



We made it through the first grading period! Friday, October 14th marked the last day of the grading period. Report cards will be available on the Focus Portal October 26th. Families need a Focus Portal account to access student grades and attendance. Contact your child's school for the parent portal letter which includes your child's name, student ID, and parent portal pin. Then visit https://leon.focusschoolsoftware.com/focus/auth/ and follow the directions that are included on the letter.

STAY CONNECTED

Make sure your contact information is up to date! Join the teacher's Remind, the school's listserv, and commit to attending at least one (1) school event by December 15. Strong communication between school and home are essential! A child's academic performance improves when there is positive communication between parents and teachers. If you haven't already done so, contact your child/ren's teacher to schedule a parent-teacher conference. Ask for tips to help your child at home.

PARENT ENGAGEMENT

Parent engagement in their child/ren's education has a positive impact on student achievement. Students with engaged parents are more likely to have better social skills, show improved behavior, attend school regularly, and graduate from high school. There are a range of opportunities for engagement, so consider some of the ways listed below to become engaged in your child/ren's education.

- Join the Parent Teacher Organization (PTO)/School Advisory Council (SAC)
- Participate in school sponsored activities
- Volunteer in the school
- Complete the parent surveys
- Attend parent-teacher conferences
- Talk with your child/ren about school on a daily basis
- Have a quick conversation with school personnel
- Provide feedback
