Students interested in applying for the elective must be willing to meet the following criteria:


- Make the Yearbook Elective a priority next year

- Take photographs
- > Organize and conduct interviews with students, faculty, and administration
- > Develop and follow through on marketing ideas for the yearbook

When appropriate, the application process (form availability and deadline) will be announced on the M.M.S. morning news, the M.M.S. Website, and on Listserve, providing students with ample time to complete the application tasks.

Any applications that are incomplete or turned in after the due date will not be considered for the class. What is a caption?

A caption is a piece of writing that accompanies a photo or illustration. Yearbook captions are the most read parts of the book. Therefore, they must be well-written, interesting, and detailed.

Tips for writing captions:


- > Captions are written in complete sentences that are engaging and descriptive.
- > The names of individuals in the pictures should be included in the captions.
- A caption should reveal *more than* just what is in the picture. Don't just state the obvious... What is really going on?
- > The writing should be in the 3^{rd} person.
- > Do not begin captions with the words "this" or "here."
- ➢ Good captions are more than one sentence.
- One way to create interest in a caption is to include a quote from one of the people featured in the picture.

Need some examples? Take a look at a magazine, newspaper or textbook that features photographs to see how professionals use captions.

After reviewing the information about captions, write a caption for each of the pictures below. Write the captions as if the events occurred at Montford and Involved M.M.S. students. Make up names, quotes, and other information as appropriate. Edit and proofread your work carefully for grammar, spelling, punctuation, sentence structure, and word choice. You may write or type your captions on a separate piece of paper, if you prefer.
