

Summer Reading for 2021 Rising 6th Graders







Pick one activity to complete.

Use an app to design the main characters however you would like. Following this, create a 5-8 minute discussion between the main characters where they discuss three significant moments in the book.

Write a blurb for the book. Design a code that someone will need to 'crack' in order to read the blurb. Design a book jacket with your code on the back cover.

Write a four stanza poem about the book and either do a dramatic reading of the poem or set the poem to music and record your song.

Create a movie poster for the book. Think of what symbols, lighting, images, words or phrases you could use that would convince someone to go and see the movie.

Design a travel brochure or do a video for a travel blog that will persuade someone to come visit the setting of the book. Use a photo editor or Bitmoji to create a 'family portrait' of the characters in the book. Write or voice note who the characters are. Give two traits about each one to show what their personality is like. Use evidence from the book to support your traits.

Design an abstract image of seven important symbols from the book. Write or voice note a brief explanation of how each one is a symbol and what it represents.

Alphabet Book- Create a booklet and have a word associated with the novel for each letter and provide evidence on why this event is significant.

Create a comic strip of the novel highlighting four important events in the novel.
