In other words, what usually is being conveyed when the allusion is used in literature, film, etc.? (i.e. what purpose does it serve?) Although the description of the allusion can come from other sources, the purpose sentence should be your own. This packet will be submitted to Turnitin.com the first week of school.

Example: (Please follow this format)

<u>BIG BROTHER</u> – Term from the novel *1984* by George Orwell, published in 1949. The novel depicts the horrors of totalitarian society where Big Brother, the spying government who can see into each person's home and monitor all activities, is always watching. Big Brother creates propaganda campaigns where truths are twisted to mean their opposites, language is redefined, and history is edited to serve the state. Individuality counts for nothing and total compliance to Big Brother's watching eyes is expected.

<u>Purpose</u>: The term Big Brother is used to suggest a condition where a person (or group of people) is being watched closely.
