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### SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

Leon County is a rapidly growing community with nearly 300,000 in permanent residence and 50,000 college students. The economy is centered around the state government, two major universities, a large state college, and a regional medical complex. Lincoln High School is one of five public high schools in Leon County, and the most diverse with minority students making up approximately 54% of the student body consisting of approximately 2,000 students. 29% of Lincoln's population receives free/reduced lunch. Lincoln's academic program has ranked historically in the top 100 public schools annually by Newsweek Magazine. In 2016 & 2022, Lincoln was listed on the "Best High Schools" report, boasting the top college-readiness level of all area schools. Over 70% of Lincoln's graduating cohorts consistently attend a postsecondary institution, with 30% attending a four-year university. This post-secondary readiness is highlighted by Lincoln's Advanced Placement program, which offers twenty-seven AP courses to over 690 students, providing over 1,600 exams annually. Lincoln diversifies student learning through dual enrollment, partnering with the local state college, two universities, and vocational college.

## CURRICULUM

- 30 AP Courses (Art History, Drawing, Design, Biology, Calculus, Chemistry, Literature, Language Composition, Capstone Seminar and Research, Environmental Science, Physics, Psychology, European History, Human Geography, French, Latin, Chinese, Spanish Language, Spanish Literature, Music Theory, Psychology, Statistics, Art History, US History, US Government, Macroeconomics, and Pre-Calculus)
- Honors/Gifted courses in all major disciplines ("H" or "L" denoted transcript)
- Dual Enrollment courses: FSU, FAMU, TSC, and Lively Technical College.
- Career and technical programs: Business Entrepreneurship, Digital Design, Agriculture and Horticulture Sciences, Early Childhood, Culinary Arts, Digital Design, Work Study, Robotics Engineering, and Transit Equipment and Electrical (offered through Lively Vocational-Technical College partnership).

Lincoln High School operates on a nine-week grading period, with two grading periods per semester. Students are registered for six fifty-minute periods. Students can earn  $\frac{1}{2}$  credit per semester, per course, with a grade of "D" or better in that course. Class rank is determined utilizing weighted grade point averages, based on all credits attempted and/or earned, and is representative of the entire class population.

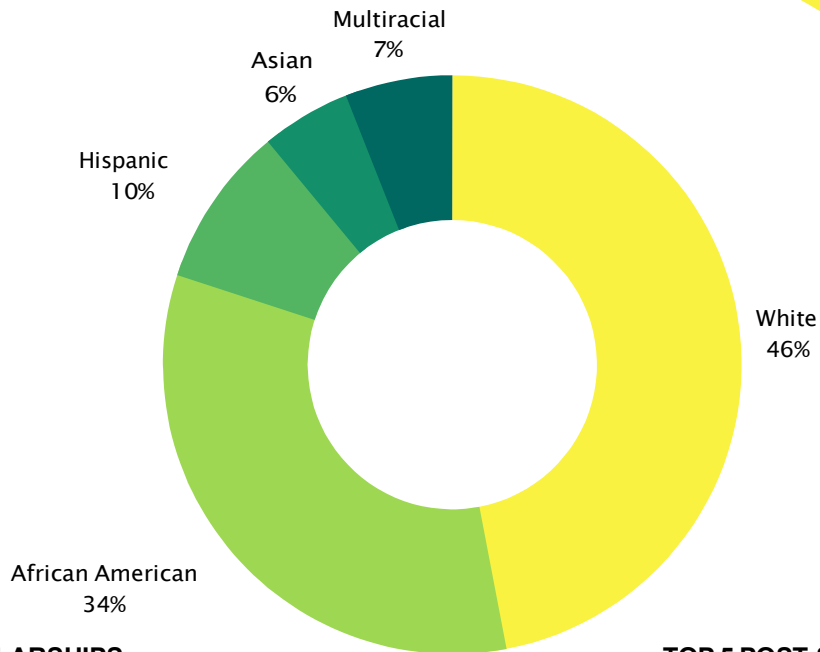
