ACTION REQUESTED: The Superintendent recommends Board action to approve negotiation with the architectural firm of Barnett Fronczak Barlowe Architects the highest ranked firm for Astoria Park Elementary School Building 01 Administration Area Finishes, Canopy Replacement and Drainage Project, in accordance with F.S. Chapter 287.055, "Consultant's Competitive Negotiations Act." Should this negotiation fail with Barnett Fronczak Barlowe Architects, then request permission to negotiate with the next ranked firm. Once negotiations have been finalized, the contract will be submitted to the Board for approval.

ITEM SUMMARY: The committee for the appointment of architects convened on March 30, 2016 to interview architectural firms for Astoria Park Elementary School Building 01 Administration Area Finishes, Canopy Replacement and Drainage Project. Seven (7) firms submitted qualification statements for this project, of which five (5) were selected to interview. The committee ranked the firms as follows:

- 1. Barnett Fronzczak Barlowe
- 2. Gilchrist Rowe Crowe Architects, P.A.
- 3. MLD Architects, LLC
- 4. DAG Architects, Inc.
- Hoy+Stark Architects

The total estimated construction budget for Astoria Park Elementary School is \$2,767,500.00.

The recommended construction delivery method for this project is Construction Management. Delivery Method analysis is attached.
