ACTION REQUESTED: The Superintendent recommends Board approval of the Selection Committee Recommendation and Award of Continuing Contracts for Emergency Construction Services for Construction Projects with Budgets Less Than \$1,500,000, for the following firms as listed in ranked order:

1. Rippee Construction, Inc.
2. RAM Construction and Development, LLC
3. Allstate Construction, Inc.

and authorize the Chair/Vice Chair or Superintendent to sign all related documents and authorize the necessary budget amendments

ITEM SUMMARY: On March 1, 8 and 15, 2016, an advertisement was published in the Tallahassee Democrat and on our Purchasing web site for RFQ 363-2016 Continuing Contract for Emergency Construction Services for Construction Projects with Budgets Less Than \$1,500,000. Eight (8) firms submitted the required documentation for qualification. Based on the rankings of the Short List Committee, the District identified five (5) firms to make public presentations to an Interview Committee. The Interview Committee evaluated the presentations and ranked the firms in the order set forth above. The Superintendent recommends that the Board approve the recommended ranking of qualified firms set forth above, and award the attached Continuing Contracts to the top three (3) ranked firms. The term of the contract shall be from July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017.

The selection process for continuing contracts for emergency construction services with budgets less than \$1,500,000, is governed by LCS Policy 6320.02 and state law. LCS Policy 6320.02 Continuing Contracts, Annual Continuing Contracts for Emergency Services, paragraph A. specifies the District will contract with three (3) firms.

Failure to file a protest within the time prescribed in section 120.57(3), Florida Statutes, or failure to post the bond or other security required by law within the time allowed for filing a bond shall constitute a waiver of proceedings under chapter 120, Florida Statutes.
