 -<u>citizens</u> petition (collect) signatures
 -advertise with propaganda -law/proposition
is on ballot
-majority rules

referendum

-<u>legislators</u> put a law on the ballot -advertise with propaganda

-someone's job is on the line !





Two types of Voting

**Majority Rules** 

The voters cast the votes (ex: SGA elections)

All laws and <u>most</u> politicans on the ballot are chosen this way

Direct system of voting

Winner Take All

The electoral college casts the votes

ONLY the President and Vice President are chosen this way
