Encourage your child to use accurate grammar and complete sentences throughout the day.

A lot can be accomplished when your child/ children help with the laundry.



Compare and contrast articles in the laundry while you fold.

“Your shirt is big but mommy’s shirt is bigger and daddy’s is the biggest.”

“These socks don’t match because this one has more stains.”

Best of all - it saves you time!

Definition:

Comparative and superlative adjectives - describe and compare nouns and/or pronouns.

Comparative adjectives are often formed by adding -er to an adjective.

Superlative adjectives are often formed by adding -est to an adjective.

Examples:

Regular Comparatives

whiter	smaller	bigger	sweeter
hotter	sillier	slower	

Superlative Adjectives

whitest	smallest	biggest	sweetest
hottest	silliest	slowest	

Some **comparative** and **superlative adjectives** must use “more” or “most” with an adjective that does not change.

more/most beautiful	more/most horrible	more/most delicious
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Irregular comparative and **superlative adjectives** change form completely

good, better, best	many, more, most	little, less, least
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
