Family Photo Albums

Look through family photo albums and discuss them.

Forming sentences about the pictures while answering questions...

who is in the picture,
what is happening,
when did it happen,
why were they doing ____,
where were they,
and how did they do it.

Definition:

Direct object - noun or pronoun in a sentence that receives the action of a verb or shows the result of the action.

Examples:

Direct objects follow the action verb in a sentence and answer the questions "What received the action?" or "Who received the action?"

I love puppies.

Love is the verb, and **pupples** is the direct object because pupples receive the action.

Jimmy *called* **Brenda** yesterday.

Called is the verb, and **Brenda** is the direct object because Brenda received the action.

Mr. Jones *gave* a **test** to his students.

Gave is the verb, and **test** is the direct object because the test received the action.
