
Language Tips



A lot can be accomplished when your child/ children help with the laundry.

Definition:

Pronoun = takes the place of a noun (person, place, or thing) in a sentence. **Pronouns** can be personal, possessive, reflexive, or demonstrative. **Pronouns** can be masculine (he), feminine (she), or neutral (it) in gender and can be singular (one) or plural (two or more).

Examples:

Personal	pronouns	identify a	person	or thing

- I - you - he - she - it - me - him

- her - we - they - us - them

Possessive pronouns show ownership to someone or something

- my - mine - your - yours - his - her - hers

- its - our - ours - their - theirs - whose

Reflexive pronouns refer to a noun or another pronoun in a sentence

- yourself - myself - himself - herself - itself - ourselves

- vourselves - themselves

Demonstrative pronouns identify and specify particular nouns or pronouns using

- this - that - these - those
