Was/Were + Verbing Homework

Definition:

Was/Were + Verbing = describes an action that happened in the past (yesterday, a month ago) or an action that was started and was or was not finished.

Examples:

Was + verbing = one person, place, or thing (singular subject) was doing the action in the past

- Tom was reading a chapter book.
- Lily was eating ice cream.
- He was jogging.
- The phone was ringing.

Are + verbing = two or more people, places, or things (plural subject) were doing the action in the past.

Were + verbing also follows the singular pronoun you.

- You were smiling.
- We were walking to school.
- They were helping the teacher.
- The glaciers were melting.
