

STATE RESEARCH LAPBOOK Teacher Directions

- I. Decide if you want your students to complete all, or some, of the foldables.
- 2. Print, and copy, the pages on regular, letter size paper. Do not print on both sides.
- Foldable sheets contain some direction details.
- 4. Give each student a legal size manila folder. Fold both sides of the folder in toward the middle to create a lapbook.
- 5. Have students glue foldables onto the lapbook. With careful placement, all foldables will fit onto one legal size file folder, with one large foldable on the back.


