<u>Slide One</u> : Begin with a question or a statement about your book.				
<u>Slide Two</u> : This should be a second question or another statement about the book.				
<u>Slide Three</u> : The title and author of your story.				
<u>Slide Four</u> : Setting of the novel. Include a picture and a statement about the <u>place</u> .				
<u>Slide Five</u> : Setting of the novel. Include a picture and a statement about the <u>time period</u> when the novel takes place.				
<u>Slide Six</u> : Themes . Introduce at least <u>two</u> themes you found in the novel. The more creative you are with the way you present this, the better your grade will be.				
<u>Slide Seven- Nine</u> : Characters . The number of characters slides will differ depending on the number of characters in your story. You must include information about the protagonist(s) as well as the antagonist(s). (If the antagonist is not a character, but is an object or an element of nature, you should mention that as well).				
<u>Slide Ten</u> : Conflict . You must name the conflict generally (man v. man, man v. nature, man v. self, man v. society) as well as specifically in terms of who or what is involved. Pictures are always a good addition.				
<u>Slide Eleven</u> : Important Quotes . Anything that a character or the narrator says that is important/relevant to the themes you presented in slide six should be stated here.				
<u>Slide Twelve</u> : Your final statement about the book. Why should we read it? What is the value?				
PowerPoint slides are neat, creative, and easy to read.				
Project follows directions and reflects quality time and effort.				
Information on slides is grammatically correct and free from errors in spelling, punctuation, etc.				
Student faces the audience and makes eye contact.
