- Odysseus-- Is he an effective leader? Is he a hero? Is he faithful to his family and homeland? **Hero's Journey Home**

We will discuss these questions throughout our reading of the book and you will see some of these concepts on the unit test.

Use your post it notes to mark important passages in the text. These markings will be very helpful later when you review the book to prepare your in-class written responses and study for your test.

As you read, write down specific questions or comments you have about your reading and bring them to class. I'll do my best to answer any question you have, and I think that bringing questions and comments to class each day will help to start very interesting classroom discussions.
