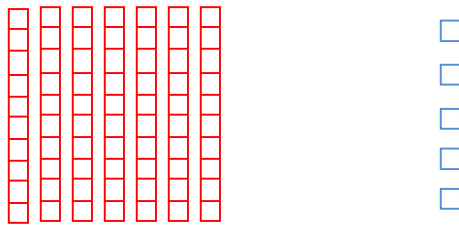


CHAPTER 6 VOCABULARY

ones - the value of a digit in the ones place on a place value chart

ten: a group of ten ones

ex. $75 = 7$ tens and 5 ones



hundred - a number that is equal to ten tens or 100 ones



TRICKY CONCEPTS

Counting by tens- Although most first graders know how to count by tens starting at a number that has a zero in the ones place (ex. 10, 20, 30...), the concept of counting by tens starting at a number with any other digit in the tens place proves to be more difficult (ex. 3, 13, 23, 33, 43). Using a hundred chart can help significantly. Have your child look for patterns on the chart (ex. The number in the tens place changes, but the number in the ones place stays the same).

Tens and ones in addition-

- Recognizing that “1 ten” is the same as “10” is an important concept for students to master.
 - 1 ten and 5 ones is the same as $10 + 4$ which is the same as 14
