### Graduation Requirements

In order to graduate with a standard high school diploma, students must earn 24 credits and fulfill the following requirements as listed below:

- Cumulative 2.0 unweighted GPA
- Pass 10<sup>th</sup> Grade FSA ELA with a Level 3 or higher
- Pass Algebra I end-of-course assessment
- Successfully complete at least one on-line course (All of Leon High School's Economics courses are blended and meet this requirement)
