**Assessment Limits:** Items may ask about how the author develops a point of view or purpose in the text. Items may ask about one or more viewpoints. Items may ask about the author’s word choice or use of figurative language. Items may ask about the tone or mood of the author or text. Items may ask about a lack of textual evidence or about inappropriate or unsound evidence.

<b>1</b>	<p>The student will <b>understand</b> the academic vocabulary <i>conflicting</i> and <i>credibility</i>.</p> <p>The student will be able to</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Identify</b> any point of view directly stated in a text.</li> <li>• <b>Identify</b> an author’s purpose as it is expressed simplistically (to inform, to entertain, to persuade).</li> <li>• <b>Identify</b> words or phrases that give clues to the author’s point of view or purpose.</li> <li>• <b>Identify</b> conflicting viewpoints within a text.</li> <li>• <b>Identify</b> selections in the text in which the author responds to conflicting viewpoints.</li> </ul>
