

**Primary Standard LAFS.8.RI.1.2** Determine the central idea of a text and analyze its development over the course of the text, including its relationship to supporting ideas; provide an objective summary of the text.

**Cognitive Complexity:** Level 2: Basic Application of Skills and Concepts

**Assessment Limits:** The item may refer to central ideas that are explicit or implicit in the text. The item may ask the student to determine the central idea from a section of the text or from the entire text. The item may focus on how the central idea of the text relates to supporting ideas. The item may ask the student to distinguish fact from opinion. Items may ask students to summarize the text.

  - **Analyze** each writer's use of supporting details in developing the central idea.

  - Trace the development of an implied or explicit central idea over the course of the text.
