- Assignments & upcoming tests/events

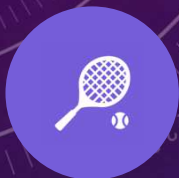
BEHAVIOR/ ACADEMICS

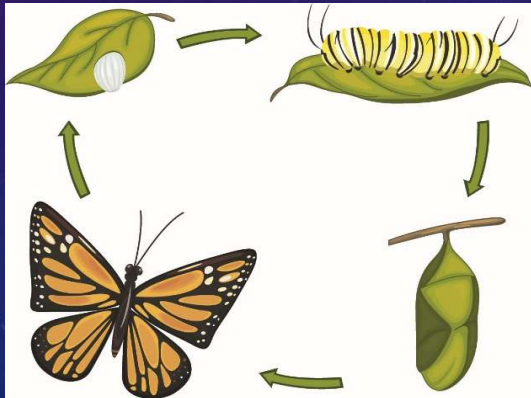
All new skills are practiced in our journals. Students should be spending a few minutes just reviewing the day's notes before starting homework. It makes a world of difference! Please, ask to see it.


