Title I Advisory Council December 9, 2021 Meeting Minutes

School highlights:

Gloria Smith: Rickards High School had its celebration naming the science building after Maggie Lewis Butler

Marie-Claire: Hartsfield had its ribbon cutting for the Family Resource Center; we hope to coordinate with other schools to learn how other schools are using their Resource Center and to share information about potential workshops for parents.

Title I office updates by Ms. Knight:

Community engagement events in November:

- Dad take your child to school
- Parent Family Engagement Spirit Week

coming up:

- 1) Pathways to Entrepreneurship, December 11: partnered with Adult and Community Education (ACE) to provide information about the pathway to obtain high school diploma/GED; Lively Technological College will be on site to provide information, as well a number of representatives from various career opportunities; TCC Workforce Development will explain what courses they offer for those looking to start a career or re-tool for a change in career; and FAMU's Small business Development Center will have a workshop about starting your own business and FAMU credit union will be on hand to give info about credit scores and micro loans. ACE FB page will livestream.
- 2) The Math of Cooking, December 14, at Godby: workshop provided to Title I parents and families to emphasize the importance of real world math. Small pilot was hosted at Griffin with a math component focusing on fractions, conversions. Families have to work through the recipe. For elementary students you might me working on reading as well. Sam Burgess is offering his time voluntarily. First 50 participants will receive a box of ingredients to make dishes at home.

Information about these workshops have gone to all Title I schools (public and charter)

Transportation provided? For the 11th, we can provide transportation if they are signed up for ACE.

3) Mobile Stem lab: principals could choose to offer this on their campus. It is a collaboration with FAMU College of Agriculture and Food Science. Rickards and Godby have chosen to host these.

FAMU is providing information about the degrees offered in connection to this field. Any K-12 school can elect to do a stem night and post the information to their community. The district and schools also rely on Peach Jar to share information.

Questions around timing of events: these events are all very close together which might make it hard to participate in all and it would be great to have them offered again in the Spring.

Ms. Knight: we are constrained by the availability of FAMU and schools hosting; also working around the exam schedules. But we are looking at what would be the best time to host these and other workshops in the new year. We might also host a District stem night for all students so that families of schools that have chosen not to do it will still have access.

Parent Family Engagement Resource Center: getting resources within schools for families. We want to discuss this further in a sub-group for best way to share resources between schools.

Newsletter update: we looked at the sections of the newsletter and we can give feedback. We discussed having the Newsletter eventually highlighting the work of the TAC.

LCTA report – (no one could be there)

Legislative update: Session starts in January and we should focus on it then. Keep in mind the Joint Resolution to make school board races partisan will be on the ballot in November so all of us should be well informed so that we can help our friends and neighbors learn about this issue.

Testing bill: drafted already and it won't be less testing just more spread out over the year. It is important to remember that there is no plan to reduce high stakes associated to testing.

Children's Week at Legislature: having kids participate would be great to understand how the legislative process works. (Governor Charter often participates)

Appointing a Secretary: Marie-Claire will be secretary for the TAC for remainder of the year.

Overview of our committee structure and subject focus:

The idea is to have these committees work on these issues during monthly meetings to come up with recommendations and advance the work of the TAC:

1- Early Childhood Education

How to increase access to quality early childhood programs

- The district created "VPK all day" where the district subsidizes the rest of the day in addition to the 3 hours of VPK. This is an initiative of he district following recommendations by the TAC.
- How to bring the Pop Up Preschool to more neighborhoods on a regular basis: see if we can grow the impact by offering the program more regularly and more widely.

The committee could add other ideas in addition to the above. These are just the ones we have made headway on so far and we want to start there.

- 2- Attracting and retaining experienced teachers and staff in Title I schools
 - What programs can we recommend be put in place to help attract teachers to Title I schools
 - How can we make the salary of Title I teachers reflective of the additional demands and responsibilities of teaching in a Title I school
 - How can LCS and the community increase funding to support Title I schools (beyond Title I funds)
- The district has implemented some measures around recruitment.
- We also want to keep experienced teachers in our Title I schools.
- We have to think outside the box.
- Often, funding limitation is a big part of what limits the ability of Principals to attract and retain teachers
- 3- Collaboration between Title I schools and how schools keep parents engaged
 - How to strengthen feeder patterns between elementary, middle and high to help with the engagement of families and make sure we don't loose them in that transition.
 - How to improve the transition of students who transfer between schools mid-year: we have high transient rates of students and we need to support them
 - How can Title I schools increase enrichment for all students to better meet their academic needs; each of our schools can have initiatives that helps meet the needs of their students.
 Making sure that students have their needs met at any of our schools.

It is important to remember that the role of the TAC is to constantly reaffirm the need to equitably invest in Title I schools. We cannot allow the Title I label to be used to excuse away lower proficiency or lower test scores; rather we must see that data as a sign that more investment is needed.

When it comes to each area of our community, we want to strengthen the feeder partners and help each school find their focus, specialization and place in its feeder pattern.

LCS Title I schools were well represented in this year's awards: Teacher of the year (Pineview), Employee of the Year (Sabal Palm), Glen Howell finalist (Ruediger Hartsfield, Pineview, Oak Ridge).
