#### **Presentation by Ashley Scott** - Title I Schools Needs Assessment

Here is a break down of the spending of the Title I funds:

77%: personnel (teachers, paras, tutoring)

5%: materials and supplies

10%: software

5%: professional development (in addition to Title II)

2%: parent and family engagement

Ms. Scott outline the process of planning at the school level:

- Highlighted some of the different plans a school may have
- Planning may take 2 months, hiring, coding and working with principals all influence the timeframe
- Plans can be 100 pages long
- DOE can come back to make a change to the plan
- Looks at qualitative and quantitative information

Parent Engagement Plan – federal requirement. District looks at these before doing any parents engagement expenditures. They also looked at Panorama survey to see the barriers.

Some District Initiatives:

Reading intervention services

Foster grandparent programs – K-2nd grade (they get professional development, more meaningful) (20,000 for 40 people) meet with them monthly

Supporting the Title I office by training all the professionals.

Departmentalizing the Title I office to help the different professionals at school site.

### **Spotlight on Oak Ridge Elementary** - Principal Jasmine Smith

Oak Ridge and Dr. Smith was introduced by Najahri Herron—an Elegant Eagle

Elegant Eagles helped with sign-in

Dr. Smith went over the 6 areas of improvement

- 1) Changes to school scheduling and introducing a morning book club
- 2) Interventions: Leveled Literacy Intervention system and morning labs for lowest quartile students
- 3) Improving progress monitoring with only 2 of those teachers being 1<sup>st</sup> year
- 4) Going from a year of 12 new hires to 10
- 5) Hiring teachers who "speak eagle"
- 6) Building partnerships with outside businesses
