

What is a Science Fair Notebook?

A formal report to be displayed with your Science Fair Project- this may be submitted digitally. Use the document that has been provided to you in Canvas, delete any extra pages or text, make sure it is in this order. It just looks neater that way.

Page 1 - Should include the name of the project, the date, and your Name

Page 2- Table of Contents - Number all pages and list them in the table of contents

Page 3- Abstract - One-page summary of your project

Page 4- Hypothesis - State your hypothesis

Page 5- Materials - Listing of all the materials you used in your experiment with quantities listed

Page 6- Procedure & Variables - Step by Step Instructions about how you did *i* our experiment. Include the number of trials or repetitions. Make sure to include the variables used in your experiment.

Page 7- Results - All the graphs, tables, and data collected during your experiment. You should also have a written summary about your results

Page 8- Conclusion - Start out by restating your hypothesis and stating whether or not your data support it. Explain any patterns you observed or any suggestions or improving your project

Page 9- Bibliography -Listing of all the sources you used while doing your project.

Page 10- Logbook- raw, hand-written, original data
