<p>Description:</p> <p>Journalism aims to be the voice of the SAIL community. We create many products, primarily the yearbook, the weekly bulletin newscast and news segments, the school newspaper, even a podcast at times. To produce all these different types of media, our students learn a variety of skills, not just writing. Journalism focuses on writing and copy editing, photography, creating digital designs and graphic designs for our products, creating and filming in a broadcast studio, scriptwriting, photo and video editing, and advertisement and distribution of these products.</p>	<p>Expectations:</p> <p>Students must have a FERPA release on file to participate in this class.</p> <p>Yearbook: Working effectively in groups, photographing school events, editing photos, designing pages</p> <p>Bulletin Broadcast/Podcast: Developing skills in studio crew and setup, filming and editing the show, working on-air as anchor or reporter, and producing news segments</p> <p>Newspaper: Investigative reporting, writing and editing in a variety of news formats, visual design and newspaper layout</p>
<p>Resources/Materials:</p> <p>Our students train using Adobe products for which students can take Adobe certification exams in this class.</p> <p>Photography and videography equipment; green screens; video and sound editing equipment</p>
