Recycle is the study we started to explore on Monday. The students enjoy learning by investatgating things we already know about. This week we have been discussing where trash is found. Children quickly became interested in picking up trash and telling what they know about it. Then they became aware of what they do not know, like where does garbage go?

Social Emotional

Our friend Z did not understand feelings. So we reviewed various types of feelings and how to predict feelings. We were able to label feelings and tell why someone may feel a certain way. Knowing the situation helps the students predict how a person may feel and react.



We introduced a few St. Patrick's Day songs "I'm a Little Leprechaun", "Dance, Dance, Leprechauns Dance", and "G-R-E-E-N St. Patrick's Day". We also had fun learning how to play Simon Says and learning how to do the motions of toys like a Jack in the box.

Letter Sound Study

After tracing the "Xx" and "Zz", we put x'es on "Xx" and zigzags on "Zz".



We reviewed counting by 1's, 5's and 10's. We did a varied of activities that let us use tally marks. We worked hard to understand how to make the 4 verticle marks with a 5th slanted line over them. The children amazed us by understanding how to play Tick Tack Toe. They quickly understood 3 in a row and drawing the winning line. With more experience they will start to learn blocking. This game teaches them to reason, take turns, and pattern.

Literacy



Along with the new study we introduced new books. This week we examined "The Paper Bag Princess" and "Hush", a Thai Lullaby. We discussed the story line in these books. Books with dragons and castles are always enjoyable reading for kids. "The Paper Bag Princess" ends with a twist that is difficult to understand. It defiantly takes several readings to understand. "Hush" is easy to understand an fun to say the repetitive phrases.
