A Leon County Schools' teenage parent or prenatal student has the option to participate in the core TAPP housed at the Success Academy and the Early Childhood Professional Development Center (ECPDC - License Number C02LE0236 ) or as a TAPP student at a Leon County home zone or choice school.

## Child Care Services for TAPP Students



### Where?

Our licensed child care center is part of the Early Childhood Professional Development Center (ECPDC) of Leon County Schools located between Lively Technical College and Tallahassee Community College.

### How Old?

Infants four weeks of age and older may be enrolled in the licensed care center at ECPDC.



### When?

Child care is provided during school hours, while the parent is at school. On days the teen parent is not at school, the child may not attend school at ECPDC. If the teen parent leaves school for an appointment, illness, or other reason, the child must be picked up immediately. School attendance for both parent and child is essential. The teen parent's school attendance is monitored by TAPP and the teen parent's secondary school.

### How Do I Register My Baby?

Just call for an appointment. You will need to bring your child's birth certificate, physical exam form, Florida shot record, and your student enrollment verification. TAPP is a voluntary drop-out prevention program and requires signed permission by a parent or guardian.
