Hartsfield is a nationally certified Eco-School, awarded a Bronze-Level Status by the National Wildlife Federation for the creation of a schoolyard habitat for monarchs and other pollinators.

The schoolyard habitat, as well as year-round vegetable and herb gardens, bring environmental education and awareness to life. These outdoor environments offer daily opportunities for hands-on learning, inquiry, and observation.

A school-based team of students, educators, and community volunteers comprise our Hartsfield Eco-School Action Team. The Eco-School Action Team plans for and develops projects for the school that improve sustainability practices in the classroom, on campus, and beyond.

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Mission Statement

HARTSFIELD IS A TITLE I SCHOOL

A Title I designation means that the school is a federally funded program in which funds are provided to schools serving high numbers of economically disadvantaged children. Funding for this program is based on the percentage of students attending each school who qualify for free or reduced lunch. The goal is to support schools by providing resources and effective strategies to increase student achievement.

WHAT IS A PRIMARY YEARS PROGRAMME?

Hartsfield Elementary is an International Baccalaureate Primary Years Programme Candidate School.

- PYP is a transdisciplinary curriculum that focuses on the development of the whole child as an inquirer, both at school and beyond.
- What makes PYP schools unique is "how" students are taught, versus "what" students are taught.
- IB PYP schools strive to develop internationally-minded students who are able to understand themselves and others, fostering attributes necessary to thrive within a global society.
- The PYP focuses on the development of the whole child as an engaged inquirer, demonstrating agency (ownership) for their learning both in and outside the classroom.

In the PYP classroom,

- Learning is concept-based rather than topic-based, taking place through a transdisciplinary lens. PYP Teachers also teach students multiple Approaches to Learning so that students are equipped with the skills essential to becoming lifelong learners.

IB PIPELINE CONNECTIONS

Hartsfield Elementary is uniquely poised to offer learners a direct pipeline to the IB Middle Years Programme at Fairview Middle School and the IB Diploma Programme at Rickards High School. Upon completion of the Primary Years Programme, learners will enter any middle school program with the confidence and academic skills to succeed. The rigor offered through the PYP not only establishes lifelong learners, but future thinkers prepared to tackle the world of today and tomorrow.
