Communication

Q. We have heard from each of our child's teachers many different times. It is overwhelming, what can you do?

A. Please communicate with your child's teacher(s) about your preferred communication method so that we can help manage this with you.

Q. We haven't heard from my child(ren)'s teacher(s), what should we do?

A. By now, you should have heard from your child's teacher or school. Please call your child's school between the hours of 8a-3. You are also encouraged to email your child(ren)'s teacher or school. Assessments

Q. My student is enrolled in middle school or high school, do they have to take a semester exam?

A. Aligned with the state, Leon County Schools is exempting all secondary end of semester exams. Course grades will be calculated as if those exams never existed.

Q. My student is enrolled in Advanced Placement (AP) course work. When will they take the AP Exam?

A. Please contact your child's school for a schedule and time for each course.

Q. My student is enrolled in International Baccalaureate (IB) Program. When will they take the IB exams?

A. At this time, the IB exams have been cancelled.

Q. My student is enrolled in a course with an end of the course exam (i.e. Geometry or Biology), do they have to take the state assessment?

A. The Florida Department of Education has waived all state assessments for the year. This means that any EOC course has had this assessment requirement waived. Therefore, there will be no EOC exam. This also means that the EOC exam will not count as 30% of the student's course grade. The final course grade will reflect the report card/classroom grades of the student only.

Q. My student is a senior. Do they have to pass the 10th grade ELA FSA or the Algebra I EOC?

A. For those students graduating this school year (2019-20), the graduation requirements related to the ELA and the Algebra I exams are waived.

Q. My student is not a senior, but is enrolled in Algebra 1, do they have to take the EOC exam when school returns?

A. Non-senior students enrolled in Algebra 1, have three options: the student can take the Algebra 1 EOC exam on a subsequent test administration, earn a concordant score on an approved national assessment (SAT or ACT), or the student can take Geometry and use that EOC exam as a replacement for the Algebra I graduation requirement.

Q. My student is not a senior, but is enrolled in another EOC exam course. Do they have to take those exams when school reopens?

A. No. Students will not be required to take any of the other EOC exams (i.e. Civics, Geometry, US History, or Biology) if they are enrolled in that respective course in the 2019-20 school year.

Q. My student is in third grade. I was told that s/he needed to pass the third grade ELA to be promoted. How is my child's promotion effected?

A. Students who are in third grade no longer have to take and pass the 3rd grade FSA ELA in order to be promoted. However, promotion decisions should be based on the student's classroom performance and progress monitoring data in consultation with parents, teachers, and school leaders.

Grading

Q. I am an essential worker and managing both my student(s) work and my own work at home is overwhelming, what can you do to help me?

A. Please reach out to your child's teachers and let him/her or them know. Each family circumstance is unique and LCS teachers remain committed to helping our students be successful. Your child(ren) teacher and school can help with the workload.

Q. How will student work be graded?

A. Students' work will be graded by their classroom teacher as we normally would. The district is working to develop one grading practice for the fourth nine weeks grades/report card of this school and will be communicating this update as soon as possible. Parent(s) are encouraged to speak with their child(ren)'s teacher or school administration with any concerns.

Q. We are not able to access the work online, what are we supposed to do?

A. Please contact your child(ren)'s school to determine what next steps should be taken. Expectations and levels of support for student will vary depending on the age, grade level, and type of course work expected. Similarly, schools can provide the most direct support to families in need of help with technology, such as connectivity or access to devices.

Promotion/Retention

Q. Can a parent require a student to be retained?

A. Parents play an important role in planning for their students' education. Promotion decisions should be made in consultation with parents, teachers, and school leaders based on the student's classroom performance and progress monitoring data.

Q. My student was enrolled in ACE for credit recovery while s/he was still enrolled in his or her traditional school, is ACE still open?

A. Yes, both our Adult and Community Education (ACE) program and our traditional schools are open. Please contact both ACE and your student's school for more information.

Graduation/Moving Up Ceremonies

Q. My student is a senior. What plans are being made for graduation ceremonies?

A. Every effort is being made to accommodate some kind of ceremony for seniors. Once plans are finalized- with the input of local and state health care officials- the Superintendent will make an announcement. Please stay tuned!

Q. My student is a Pre-K/K/5th grade/8th grade student. What plans are being made for moving up ceremonies?

A. At this time, we ask for some patience as we work through the next few weeks of our distance learning. With the Governor's announcement regarding our students not returning to school, we will work with our schools to creatively celebrate these important milestones in a way that is consistent with past practice yet reflects the recommendations of local and state guidelines.

Information for 2020-21

Q. My child is supposed to start Kindergarten next year. How do I register him or her?

A. If your student is currently enrolled in one of our Leon County Schools' Pre-Kindergarten programs, you do not need to do anything else. If you have any questions, you may contact the school in which your child will be enrolled in Kindergarten.

If your student is not currently enrolled in one of our Leon County Schools' Pre-Kindergarten programs, you may start the registration process in FOCUS, our student information system. Please go to www.leonschools.net/ParentPortal. You can create an account and follow the directions found on that page.

Q. How does my student register for classes for next school year?

A. Each of our schools has been doing the work necessary to get ready for the 2020-21 school year. With that said, each school will be reaching out to their students to communicate when students can select courses online. Be on the lookout for emails from your Principal or Assistant Principal of Curriculum.

Q. Are students returning to school on May 1st?

A. No. On Saturday, April 18, Governor DeSantis announced that students won't return to traditional school this school year. Our distance learning plan will continue.
