

Phonics: Short-A


Phonics: Short-A Card Game

These cards can be used many different ways.

Here are a few ideas:

1. Memory Match Game

Flip the cards upside-down on a table. Students take turns flipping pairs of cards. If students flip two cards that go together (ex: picture of a bat and the word bat.), then they get to keep both cards. The player with the most matches wins.



2. Make a Poster


Cut apart the cards and lay them on the table. Students match the picture and word cards together. Color the picture. Then glue the picture with the word onto a large sheet of construction paper.


3. Notebook Flip




4. Alphabetical Order


Cut apart the word cards. Have students place them in a line, in alphabetical order.




