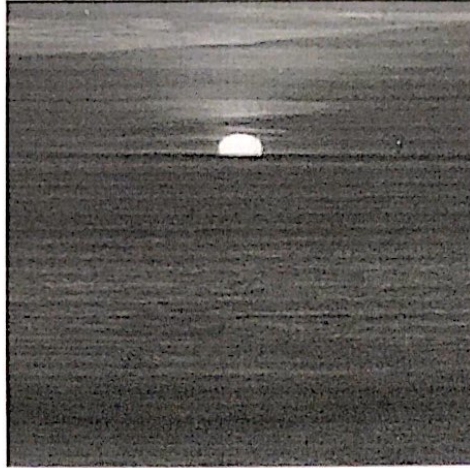

It is morning. It is time for a new day to begin. The morning sun appears. It slowly brightens the sky.

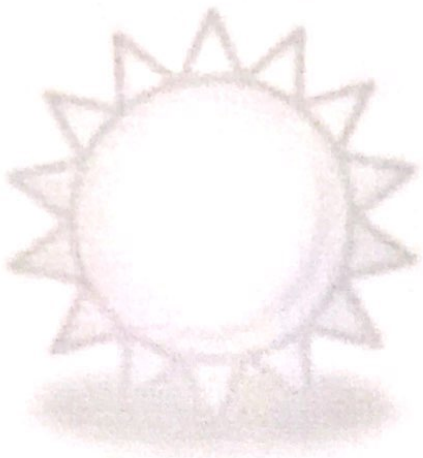
It is noon. It is the middle of the day. The sun is high in the sky. The sunlight is bright.

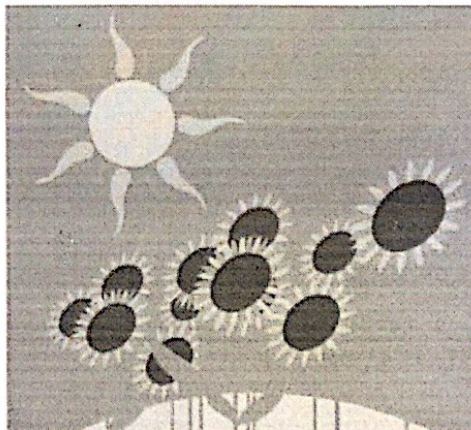

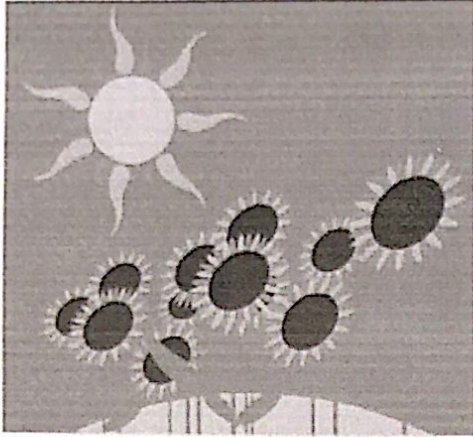

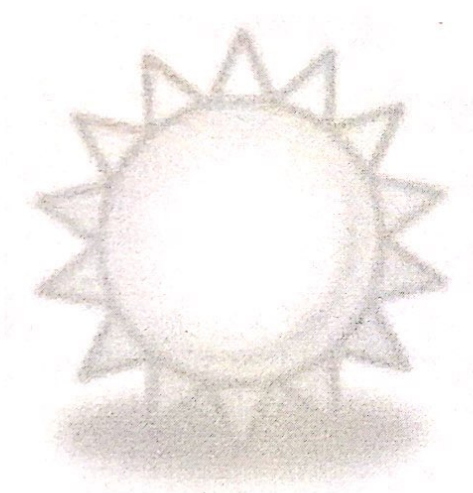
