How do people get the things they need and want?

You can use money to buy things. People work to earn money to buy things they need or want. When you buy something, you are a consumer.

Needs are things you have to have in order to live. Needs are things like food, shelter and clothing.

Wants are things you wish you had, even though you don't really need them.

Consumers

Consumers are people who pay for goods and services. Goods are things that are made for people to use. Books, food, toys and clothes are goods. A service is work or a duty that someone does for another person. If your parents pay someone to mow the lawn or wash the car, that is a service.

Deliveries

For many years, people all over the United States had milk, eggs and other dairy products delivered to their homes. They paid for the milk and eggs (the goods) and for the delivery (a service). Sometimes children would ride on the dairy trucks.



Producers

Some things we need and want are made by people. The people who make things for other people to buy are called producers.

There are many jobs people do at school. Some people work in the office. They can also work in the cafeteria. Some people work outside.

Types of Jobs at School



The school principal is the leader of our school. He or she makes rules for us to follow. The rules help keep us safe.



The school secretary works in the office. Their job is to help the principal, teachers and students.

He or she types letters and answers the phones.



A reading teacher is someone who helps us learn. Sometimes we need help learning letters and sounds. This helps us read words.



School custodians take care of the building. Their job is to clean the classrooms. They make sure the cafeteria is clean.



Crossing guards help you walk across the street. They help you before and after school. Their job is to keep children safe.



A groundskeeper takes care of the land around a school. Their job is to cut the grass, bushes and trees. He or she also picks up the trash.
