What is a timeline? A timeline is a line that shows when things happened. What does this timeline show?



Pilgrims' Timeline


Timelines can show things that happened in the past. This timeline is about the Pilgrims. They came to America a long time ago.



Do you see 1620 on the timeline? The Pilgrims came to America in the year 1620. Do you see the names of the months? The months and years on a timeline tell us when something happened.

Timelines always show events in the order they happened. Look at the timeline again. What happened first? What happened next? When did the ship land in America? What is last on the timeline?

This is the Mayflower, the ship that brought the Pilgrims to America. Color the ship.





Why did the Pilgrims come to America? They wanted to be free to worship in their own way.
