Plural nouns name more than one person, place, or thing.

- Add -s to form the plural of most nouns.
 picture/pictures wing/wings pattern/patterns
- Add -es to nouns ending in ch, sh, x, z, s, and ss.
 bunch/bunches wish/wishes box/boxes class/classes
- If a noun ends in a vowel and y, add -s. day/days boy/boys
- If a noun ends in a consonant and y, change y to i and add -es.
 city/cities lady/ladies
- Some nouns have irregular plural forms. They change spelling.
 man/men mouse/mice goose/geese foot/feet child/children
- For most nouns that end in f or fe, change f to v and add -es.
 leaf/leaves knife/knives calf/calves
- Some nouns have the same singular and plural forms.
 sheep deer moose headquarters series
